A MESSAGE FROM TICK

At the County, I've been working to bring much-needed services to our community, including expanding COVID-19 testing sites to the East Side to ensure resources are distributed more equitably.

I want to take a moment to address the Black Lives Matter movement and the tragic shooting of Officer Shay Mikalonis. I also want to commend the thousands of peaceful, Black Lives Matter protestors who have been tirelessly working to bring attention to systemic racism that permeates our society. As a white elected official, I have been listening to the movement, and I've been listening to the Black Americans and people of color in my life, on my team, and in our County. I am more determined than ever to accelerate our work towards lasting change. I will continue to fight to bring about meaningful reforms to our criminal justice system and learn new ways to approach policing. We are in a watershed moment, and I know that together, we will come out stronger than before.

INCREASED COVID-19 TESTING NEEDED

My office has been working diligently to bring testing to our district and to the East Side, as increased testing is desperately needed. Last week, in partnership with Walmart, we opened two new testing sites located at **1400 S. Lamb Blvd.** and **6570 E. Lake Mead Blvd.**

Testing is available on **Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8:00 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.** Testing requires an online appointment. Individuals being tested will be required to wear a mask, stay in their vehicles and present valid ID before using a self-administered nasal swab, supervised by a medical assistant.

I have also been strenuously advocating for the County and the Health District to open more testing sites on the East Side in addition to the Walmart testing sites. I know that our community cannot afford to wait any longer to get testing, and as soon as the additional sites are approved, my office will provide further details.

Clark County Small Business Grants

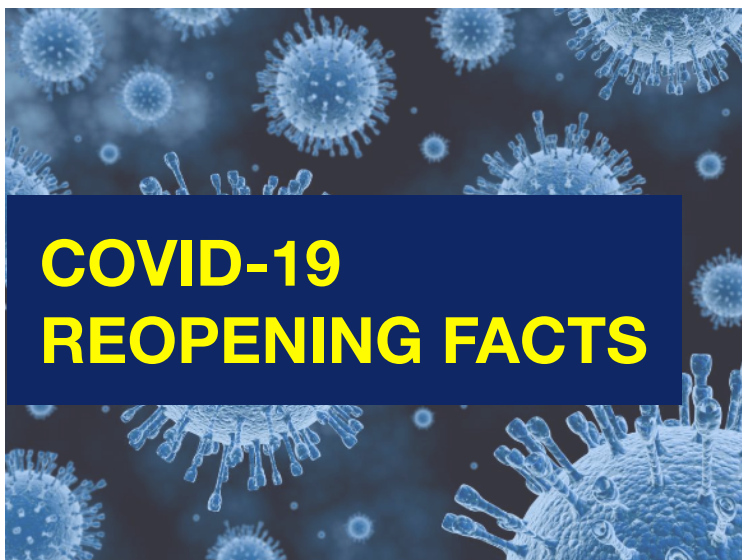


Given COVID-19's devastating economic impact on businesses, we recently approved the Small Business Stabilization Grant, Small Business Rental Assistance, and Small Business Protective Retrofit Grant. Applications for the Small Business Stabilization Grant are now available, and the deadline to apply is **Wednesday, June 24th**. This grant is available to businesses within Clark County who have 20 or fewer full-time employees as of March 15, 2020. The grant award is up to \$10,000 5-20 employees or up to \$5,000 1-4 employees. The RTC is planning an enhanced High Capacity Transit System that will replace and expand Route 109, moving people more efficiently between neighborhoods and major destinations including: The Medical District; Downtown Las Vegas; Neighborhoods including Mayfair, Southridge, Downtown, Huntridge, Winchester, and Paradise; Sunrise Hospital; Boulevard Mall; UNLV; and McCarran International Airport

In conjunction with the High Capacity Transit System, Clark County and the City of Las Vegas are developing a Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Plan. The goal of this TOD Plan is to create walkable, vibrant environments around this transit corridor that are hubs of activity for area residents and visitors.
