

Health District encourages parents to get children's school shots early

The Southern Nevada Health District urges parents and guardians to beat the back-to-school rush by bringing their pre-schoolers, kindergartners, and 7th graders for mandatory vaccinations to one of its public health centers. This year, the first day of school for students in Clark County is Monday, August 13. For information, contact the Health District's immunization clinic, (702) 759-0850 or visit the <u>Vaccines for School</u> page. Parents vaccinating a child at a Health District clinic should bring immunization records. Parents who cannot locate their children's immunization records should contact their health care provider. If their children were immunized in Nevada, parents can also visit Nevada WebIZ, a statewide immunization registry, at https://izrecord.nv.gov/public/Application/PublicPortal or call Nevada WebIZ at 1 (877) 689-3249. Non-custodial adults may accompany a child; however, written consent must be provided to the Health District from the parent or guardian at the time of service. An administrative fee and cost of vaccine may apply depending upon insurance status. The Health District accepts most insurance plans. Not all immunizations are covered by insurance. Contact the Health District's immunization clinic for information and current fee schedule.

Now until Friday, August 17, the Health District's Family Health Clinic at 280 S. Decatur Blvd. will be open Monday through Friday to offer children's physicals and office visits as part of its back-to-school activities. The cost of the physical is \$85. Clients who pay cash will receive a \$35 discount. For additional information about the Family Health Clinic, call (702) 759-0850.

The Health District is offering back-to-school immunizations at its following locations. Clients must arrive by 4 p.m. to receive services.

HIDDEN GEM

Each month we highlight a place of interest in our district.

This month we bring you: The Clark County Shooting Complex





Located at the end of north Decatur Blvd, this gem has been open since 2010. The shooting complex site is located on 2,900 acres. The actual shooting area, however, is much smaller as a larger area was planned to provide a buffer around the shooting area to provide increased safety. The Public Module presently encompasses 178 acres, and the entire build out will utilize approximately 900 acres. This modern shooting range has been designed to protect the environment while providing safe shooting opportunities for the public and comply with all federal, state, and local codes and ordinances.

RANGE FEATURES

- •Archery Center The Archery Center houses a known-distance archery range, covered firing points, port-a-potties, night lights, and a separate 3-D walking range (no lights).
- •Shotgun Center This feature contains 24 combination Trap and Skeet fields, a 5,443-square-foot Shotgun Center, a Pro Shop, shotgun storage lockers and a cafeteria. It also features 80 pull through RV sites with 30 and 50 amp hook up, a clay target storage building, lighted ranges and shade ramadas.
- •Rifle-Pistol Center The public Rifle-Pistol Center offers 30 shooting points to 50 yards; 15 points to 200 yards; 15 points to 100 yards,



- night lights, shade ramadas, concrete shooting tables and seats, covered shooting areas, a 3,000-square-foot building with a convenience store, a 30-seat classroom, restrooms and a Pro Shop.
- •Education Center This 4,400-square-foot building contains three 30-seat classrooms expandable up to one 90-seat classroom, two offices for Nevada Department of Wildlife use, and restrooms. It also features night lighting, a 100-meter archery range, a 100-yard range, and a 50-yard range. It also includes a shotgun range and two walking field courses.





The epicenter of the Clark County Shooting Complex is the world-class Shotgun Center. The Shotgun Center houses a Pro Shop including Beretta apparel to firearms cleaning and tool kits, and Clark County Shooting Complex logo items. Try a few rounds of trap or skeet, or participate in our many events including a Wednesday night trap league. Enjoy great food by Road Kill Grill II, featured in Guy Fieri's "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives. If you're not into firearms, or have small children, there is a family-oriented, fixed distance Archery Range with a shaded overhang and targets out to 100 yards. There is also a 3D course with two miles of trail and a wide selection of targets at varying distances. In addition, this area features a separate, large shade structure with eight picnic tables and BBQ grill. Bring the family and enjoy the peace and quiet while having your own picnic. Rental equipment for all ages is available for a nominal fee.

The Complex is focused on being the best (safe, affordable, fun, family oriented, public, world class) shooting facility in the world. With focus on training, education and programs to support the shooting sports. For more information visit

Northern I-215 Beltway Getting Full Buildout Between North 5th & UPRR

Motorists including those who frequent the Veterans Administration hospital at 6900 North Pecos Rd. in North Las Vegas should be aware that work is getting underway on fully building out the I-215 Beltway from North 5th Street to the Union Pacific Railroad, just west of Range Road.

The Pecos Road crossover at the beltway closed starting **Monday**, **July 23** as work when crews began work on the bridge. Westbound Beltway traffic now has to access Pecos Road to and from the south at Lamb Boulevard, Losee Road or other alternative routes. The crossover will be closed for two to three months while, Las Vegas Paving, works on the footings, columns and abutments of the Pecos Bridge. During this time, crossovers at Lamb Blvd. and Losee Road will remain open.

A \$70 million project, it includes building out I-215 to a full freeway, including new interchanges and bridges at the Beltway with Losee, Pecos and Lamb and related work including pavement, medians, high-mast lighting, drainage facilities and more. The project also includes work extending south of the Beltway for each road of Losee, Pecos and Lamb and associated drainage facilities. There will be some work occurring along the Beltway from Decatur to North 5th during the first six months.

"We're very excited to move this project forward," said Commissioner Marilyn Kirkpatrick, who added that the project is getting underway sooner than previously anticipated. This portion of the beltway is in the commissioner's district.

Motorists should pay attention to area message boards as work continues over the course of the next 21 months.
