V. Informational Items

1. Receive a report from Las Vegas Valley Water District regarding the current well levels, status of the Blue Diamond Water System and other related concerns (for discussion only)

LVVWD Derek Jackson handed out the well level report and stated the water levels are the highest in 5 years. During the last month there was a small leak on Cottonwood was resolved.

2. Receive a report from Metro regarding activity and statistics during the past month and other area crime concerns (for discussion only)

Sergeant Dean reported that there were 54 calls for service in the Red Rock area, 4 of which were in Blue Diamond.

3. Receive an update on the Red Rock Bike Trail from a representative of the Red Rock Trail Partnership (for discussion only)

Sheila Billingsley shared there is a small funding gap, but the project is moving forward. The taskforce will be coming out for a site visit in July.

4. Receive a report from Clark County Administrative Services regarding xeriscape options for Blue Diamond Park, grading issues within the Red Rock Overlay and any other updates from Clark County.

Meggan Holzer discussed xeriscape possibilities for non-functional turf areas in Blue Diamond Park and requested feedback at the next meeting regarding usage of turf areas.

Meggan reported that she spoke with Planning and Building Department management and the term "minimal grading" within the Red Rock Overlay is subjective, not specific. Discussion followed including concerns about maintaining native vegetation, the intent of the overlay, and how to re-visit the language in the code.

Meggan provided clarification on the "density and intensity restrictions" within the Red Rock Overlay.
