DECISIONS & ACTIONS

WHAT WE'VE ACCOMPLISHED RECENTLY

- Created a comprehensive **map of the justice system interventions** for a person encountering the justice system to identify gaps and areas of improvement.
- Won a place in the prestigious **MacArthur Foundation Safety and Justice Challenge**, which provides grant dollars and technical assistance to build our capacity to lower the jail population and increase equity for all justice system-involved people.
- Selected Miami, Florida's successful **mental health and substance abuse intervention program** as a model for replication in Clark County, with a focus on the County's unhoused population.
- Launched a CJCC **Jail Navigators** program staffed with nine people to help incarcerated and recently released people access community resources needed to help them transition back to the community successfully and sustainably.
- Oversee a new **Community-Based Medically Assisted Treatment Program (MAT)** that extends behavioral health and recovery resources for returning individuals already participating in the jail-based MAT program to help them continue their recovery journeys successfully.
- Played a leadership role in the expansion and relocation of the County-level public-private collaborative "**One Safe Place**" initiative providing a one-stop shop where survivors of domestic violence and trafficking can access comprehensive case management, legal, and other resources.

OUR ACTION ROADMAP TODAY

BETTER SYSTEM-WIDE DATA & INFORMATION

- Beginning with the innovative design and use of a pilot data dashboard for North Las Vegas Courts.
 Capture accurate, consistent demographics across all courts.
 - Identify specific race and ethnicity demographic data standards.
- Identify and track demographic data for those denied from specialty courts or supportive services.
- Develop a protocol to improve information sharing among stakeholders involved in DV cases.

IMPROVED PROCESS & SERVICES

- Improve pre-trial risk assessments and their use.
- Improve the quality and impact of DV offender training.

EQUITABLE ACCESS & SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

- Leverage the Clark County Language Access Plan to ensure sufficient **translation and interpretive services** to justice system-involved individuals.
- Increase awareness of and access to **behavioral health and human services supports for the unhoused** by those working in the justice system.
- Ensure current community-level collaborative initiatives address the **upstream and criminal justice**related challenges of the unhoused.
- Establish a DUI committee to address the high rates of DUI-related fatalities in Clark County.
