2018 ALL MAIL BALLOT SPECIAL ELECTION – JULY 17, 2018 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING THE REPUBLICAN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR NOMINEE TO APPEAR ON THE 2018 GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

The Republican primary for Clark County Public Administrator will be redone with a special election due to voting discrepancies in the June 12, 2018 primary. This will be an all-mail ballot election; voters eligible to vote in this election will receive their ballots at the residential address listed on their voter registration, or the mailing address provided.

Only voters that participated in the Republican 2018 Primary Election will be eligible to participate. Mail ballots can be mailed in the envelope provided with your ballot or dropped off at one of the mail ballot drop-off locations listed below.

The mail ballots ***must*** be received in our office by 7:00 p.m. on July 17, 2018.

Voters can only bring in their own ballot.

Voters eligible for the special election may vote their mail ballot in person at the Election Center 965 Trade Drive, Suite A, North Las Vegas, NV 89030 during normal business hours or on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The following Drop-Off locations will be available through July 17, 2018 during regular business hours, except on July 4, 2018. Locations will be closed on Wednesday, July 4, 2018. On Election Day, the Election Center location will be open for extended hours from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

2018 General Close of Registration Deadlines

Standard Registration - Tuesday, October 9, 2018

Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration, without having to appear in-person at the Election Department offices, or without having to register on the Secretary of State's Internet site. (NRS 293.560)

Extended In-Office & Online Registration (7 days)

Wednesday, October 10 – Tuesday, October 16, 2018

You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY by the following means: 1) In-person at the Election Department offices; or 2) On the Secretary of State's Internet site at <http://nvsos.gov/sos>. (NRS 293.560(5))

Extended Online Registration (2 days)

Wednesday, October 17 – Thursday, October 18, 2018

You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY on the Secretary of State's website. The Election Department is NOT legally required to send you a sample ballot for the current election if you register or update your address during these two days.

2018 Mail/Absentee Ballot Request Deadline

Tuesday, October 30, 2018 – 5:00 p.m.

The last day for the Election Department to RECEIVE WRITTEN mail ballot requests.

All Field Registrars must forward all completed applications in their possession by *end of day on October 9, 2018*. Check Your Voter Record

Directly Notify the Election Department

When you change your address, name or political party, be sure to inform the Election Department **BEFORE** the registration deadline. Updating your DMV or Post Office records will **NOT** also update your voter registration. Quickly see your registration information on record with the Clark County Election Department by logging in to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and selecting **View My Registration Information** from the dropdown menu.

Address Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your address online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Address** from the dropdown menu to complete and print a form to mail before the registration deadline; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your address change before the registration deadline. If non-forwardable mail, such as your Voter Registration Card or sample ballot, is returned as "undeliverable" or indicating you've moved, your registration may become "[inactive](#)." The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires the Election Department to CANCEL your registration if your registration is "inactive" and you do not vote in two consecutive federal elections. You must then re-register to vote again.

Party Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your political party affiliation online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Party Affiliation** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your party change before the registration deadline.

Name Changes

Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Name** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application. You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your name change before the registration deadline. When you change your name by marriage or other legal means, properly complete a Voter Registration Application in its entirety and include your new name and handwritten signature. No proof of the change is required. If your name is not current when you go to vote, you must sign the precinct register with your old name. You will also be given a Voter Registration Application to make the name change for the next election.

U. S. Armed Force Members and Family FPCA Deadline

Tuesday, October 30, 2018 – 5:00 p.m.

Nevada's Effective Absentee System for Elections, or EASE, is an online application that seamlessly integrates voter registration and electronic ballot delivery and marking. EASE is available to members of the United States Armed Forces, their spouses and dependents, and Nevada voters who reside outside of the country. The registration must be received by the seventh day before the election, NRS 293D.300 (2). 2018 General Early Voting (14 days)

Saturday, October 20 – Friday, November 2, 2018

Any voter registered in Clark County may vote at any early voting site within the County. Hours and days vary by location. You can view the early voting schedule on our website at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote. **Early Voting Schedule:** Your sample ballot contains the dates, times, and locations of [early voting](#) sites open during a 14-day period before Election Day. You may vote at any site you wish, no matter where you live in the County or what your precinct is. Hours and days vary by site.



2018 General Election Day

Tuesday, November 6, 2018 – 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Candidates who receive the most votes in a General Election are elected to office. You may vote for all offices and questions on the ballot for your precinct, regardless of your party affiliation. The contests applicable to your precinct will appear in the order you will see them on your actual ballot. In General Elections, ballot questions for which you are eligible to vote will also be included.

A General Election must be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November in each even-numbered year. ([NRS 293.12755](#))



Electronic Sample Ballot For Upcoming Elections

How to Submit a Request: You now have the option of receiving an electronic sample ballot by e-mail instead of a paper one by postal mail, but **you MUST submit an online request**. Log in to [Registered Voter Services](#). Then, select **Request My Sample Ballot Electronically (Go Green)** from the **Voter Services dropdown menu** at the top of the page, enter your e-mail address, and click "Save." You will immediately receive a confirmation e-mail indicating that you will no longer receive paper sample ballots. If you do not receive the confirmation, check your spam or junk mail folder first before you [contact us](#).
