Election Workers Needed for 2018!

The Clark County Election Department needs **YOU** to work at the polls on Election Day and/or during early voting. Bilingual language skills in English and Spanish or Tagalog are desirable but not required. For more information, please call the Election Department at **(702) 455-2815** or go to our website at www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote, log-in to “Registered Voter Services” and select “Apply to Be a Pollworker” from the dropdown menu.

When: June 12, 2018, Primary Election Day
May 26 – June 8, 2018, Early Voting

November 6, 2018, General Election Day
October 20 – November 2, 2018, Early Voting

Pay: Election Day: \$150.00 (One Day)
Early Voting: \$10.00/hour (Hours and Days Vary)

Requirements:

- Registered voter in Clark County, NV
- Not a candidate or relative of a candidate
- Able to perform all duties; for Election Day endure long hours (about 14 hours); for Early Voting, flexibility for a variable schedule.
- Attend a training class and pass a hands-on evaluation

2018 Non-Judicial Candidate Filing

Candidates may file to run for office from **March 5, 2018 (Monday) to March 16, 2018 (Friday), 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.**, except weekends and holidays. **Appointments are not available.** See the complete Candidate Guide at www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote.

Fees: Candidates must pay the required fees and paid by cash, cashier's check or certified check (*payable to the Clark County Election Dept. if that is where the candidate files for office*). **NRS 293.193 does not allow personal checks.**

Judicial and non-judicial offices with jurisdictions covering the entire state or multiple counties must file with the Nevada Secretary of State's Office. See the Secretary of State's guides at <http://nvsos.gov/index.aspx?page=1328>.

2018 Independent Candidate Petition Filing

Independent Candidate Petition Filing: January 2 – June 1, 2018

Period during which independent candidates must submit their petition of candidacy to the appropriate filing officer for verification. 2018 Primary Close of Registration

Standard Registration Deadline is Tuesday, May 15, 2018

Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration, without having to appear in-person at the Election Department offices, or without having to register on the Secretary of State's Internet site. (NRS 293.560)

Extended In-Office & Online Registration (7 days)

Wednesday, May 16 – Tuesday, May 22, 2018

You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY by the following means: 1) In-person at the Election Department offices; or 2) On the Secretary of State's Internet site at <http://nvsos.gov/sos>. (NRS 293.560(5))

Extended Online Registration (2 days)

Wednesday, May 23 – Thursday, May 24, 2018

You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY on the Secretary of State's website. The Election Department is NOT legally required to send you a sample ballot for the current election if you register or update your address during these two days.

Attention Field Registrars

Thank you for your continuous participation! Close of Registration is around the corner and we want to send you a few reminders. All Field Registrars must forward all completed applications in their possession by *end of day on May 15, 2018*. 2018 Mail/Absentee Ballot Request Deadline

Tuesday, June 5, 2016 – 5:00 p.m.

The last day for the Election Department to RECEIVE WRITTEN mail ballot requests.

2018 Primary Early Voting (14 days)

Saturday, May 26 – Friday June 8, 2016

Any voter registered in Clark County may vote at any early voting site within the County. Hours and days vary by location. You can view the early voting schedule on our website at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote.

2018 Primary Election Day

Tuesday, June 12, 2018 – 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

A Primary Election is a preliminary (nominating) election to select, when necessary, Democratic, Republican and nonpartisan candidates who will run in the General Election contests (except candidates for special district offices that will only appear in the General Election).

(Closed Primary NRS 293.257)

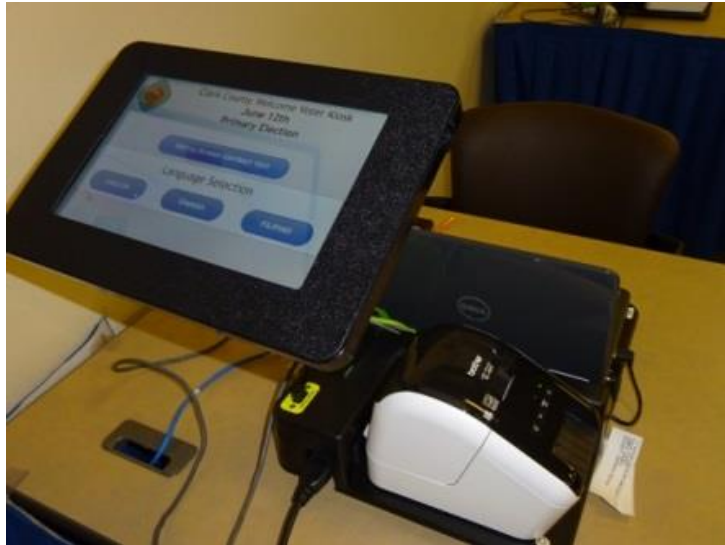


New – Vote Centers on Election Day!!

In 2018, Clark County will begin using “Vote Centers” instead of traditional Election Day polling places. If you are registered to vote in Clark County, you may vote on Election Day at any Vote Center. Vote Centers will give you the flexibility and convenience to choose your voting location.

New Voting Equipment!!

Exciting changes are coming for the voters of Clark County in 2018! The Election Day and Early Voting check-in process is changing for Clark County voters. On Election Day traditional paper rosters will be replaced with electronic poll book kiosks.



Clark County is upgrading the voting machines that voters will be using in the upcoming 2018 Elections. The new machines operate similarly to the previous machines, but with some notable differences. The display screen is larger, clearer and with highly recognizable touchscreen features. The printer will display the selections in larger font and functions the same as the previous printer. Overall this system is integrated, intuitive and easy to use.





Electronic Sample Ballot For Upcoming Elections

How to Submit a Request: You now have the option of receiving an electronic sample ballot by e-mail instead of a paper one by postal mail, but **you MUST submit an online request**. Log in to [Registered Voter Services](#). Then, select **Request My Sample Ballot Electronically (Go Green)** from the **Voter Services dropdown menu** at the top of the page, enter your e-mail address, and click "Save." You will immediately receive a confirmation e-mail indicating that you will no longer receive paper sample ballots. If you do not receive the confirmation, check your spam or junk mail folder first before you [contact us](#).
