REGISTRATION DEADLINES

Online Close of Registration, Tuesday, October 7 - 15, 2020 – Last day to register or update your existing registration online through the Secretary of State’s Website at www.RegistertoVoteNV.gov.

Same Day Registration Period* – Voters that register during this period will be required to present an unexpired Nevada Driver’s License or Identification Card issued by the DMV. See our website for more information regarding Same Day Registration requirements at www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote or your sample ballot. Same Day Registration will be available at all Clark County polling places.

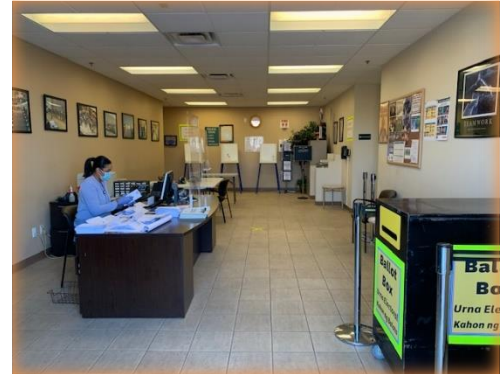
Tuesday, November 3, 2020 – 7:00 p.m.

Nevada’s Effective Absentee System for Elections, or EASE, is an online application that seamlessly integrates voter registration and electronic ballot delivery and marking. EASE is available to members of the United States Armed Forces, their spouses and dependents, and Nevada voters who reside outside of the country. For more information you can go to the Federal Voting Assistance Program site at <https://www.fvap.gov/>.

FPCA voters must provide the following information in order for the request to be processed.

What we need in order to process the FPCA:

- Classification (per block -1 of the FPCA)
- Address last domiciled before leaving the US (per block 2 of the FPCA)
- Where you are now (per block 3 of the FPCA)
- Ballot receipt preference (per block – 5 of the FPCA)
- Signature (per block – 7 of the FPCA)

EARLY VOTING AND ELECTION DAY FOR THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020 GENERAL ELECTION

EARLY VOTING begins October 17th and ends on October 30, 2020 with various hours and locations. All early voting locations serve as drop off locations for further convenience.

ELECTION DAY is Tuesday, November 3, 2020 from 7am to 7pm. All election day locations serve as drop off locations for further convenience.

WHATS NEW IN NEVADA ELECTIONS

Mail Ballot All active registered voters will receive a mail ballot for the 2020 General Election. All voted mail ballots must be dropped off or mailed by Election Day. Mail ballot return envelopes must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the Election Department on or before the seventh day after Election Day. If you decide to vote in-person instead of by mail, you will need to do one of the following:

- Surrender your mail ballot (preferably in the packet sent to you) to an election official at the voting site.
- If you do not surrender your ballot, you will sign an affirmation at the voting site swearing that you have not already voted in the current election and that you understand no one may attempt to vote or actually vote more than once in the same election.

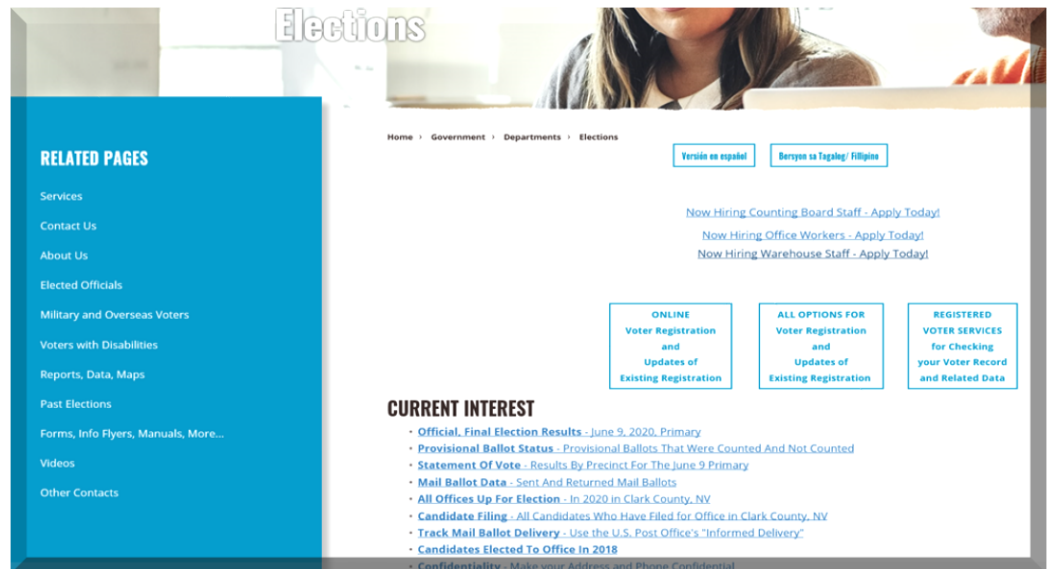
Restoration of Right to Vote law has changed for Nevada residents with felony convictions in Nevada or in any other state who are currently not in prison. They are now allowed to immediately register to vote. This also applies to persons whose voter registration had been previously cancelled because of a felony conviction and to

persons who are currently on probation or parole. No special procedures or paperwork are required.

Provisional Voting will now include a full ballot, regardless of the reason for casting a provisional ballot. This means they will contain all offices, candidates, and questions that would be on a regular ballot for the voter's precinct. After an election, the Secretary of State will establish a system, such as a website or toll-free number, to inform voters of provisional status.

U.S. POST OFFICE INFORMED DELIVERY



Digitally preview your mail and manage your packages scheduled to arrive soon! Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces and track packages in one convenient location. You can check the delivery of your mail ballot with this easy to use service.
