Contract & Interlocal Agreement Management

- ✓ Awarded an Interlocal Agreement to National Park Service (NPS) for Peregrine Falcon Monitoring at Lake Mead National Recreation Area, Project No. 475.
- ✓ Awarded an Interlocal Agreement to NPS for Lake Mead Geographic Information Systems and Data Management Support, Project No. 525.
- ✓ Awarded an Interlocal Agreement to NPS for Monitoring of Illegal Ground Disturbance, Project No. 526.
- ✓ Awarded an Interlocal Agreement to NPS for Monitoring of Road Conditions and Signs, Project No. 529.
- ✓ Awarded an Interlocal Agreement to NPS for Inventory, Monitoring and Research of Watch Species, Project No. 536.

Other Administrative Accomplishments

- ✓ Worked on closeout of Round 4 Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA)-funded projects.
- ✓ Migrated to SNPLMA Automated System Application Process for reporting and reimbursements.
- ✓ Began design and development of the Milestone and Deliverable Tracking Module of the automated contract administration and project management tracking system.
- ✓ Attended the Round 8 SNPLMA signing ceremony and received Notice of Availability of funds from the Bureau of Land Management.

2009-2011 Implementation Plan and Budget Process

- ✓ Hosted a conference call with the Implementing Agencies on February 11, 2008 to discuss the process and answer questions (see attachment)
- ✓ Hosted a workshop between the Implementing Agencies and the Science Advisor (Desert Research Institute (DRI)) to craft a set of criteria and a scoring system for DRI's review and ranking of project concepts (see attachment).
- ✓ Issued a request for project concepts to the Implementing Agencies on March 3, 2008.
- ✓ Received seven (7) project concepts in response on March 28, 2008.

Boulder City Conservation Easement

- ✓ Patrol Statistics:
 - Made contact with 411 visitors to the easement
 - o Handed out 251 maps, 221 brochures, and 254 refrigerator magnets
 - o Issued four (4) citations
 - o Installed 26 "No Motor Vehicles" signs
 - o Installed eight (8) "Designated" route signs
 - o Replaced two (2) "No Dumping" signs
 - o Replaced one (1) "No Shooting" signs
- ✓ Reviewed Boulder City's Feasibility Study and Alternatives for Wastewater Discharge and transmitted comments in favor of alternatives that would have the least impact on the easement.
- ✓ Consulted with Western Area Power Administration on its Davis-Mead 230-kV Transmission Line Reconductor Project. Requested minimization and mitigation measures to reduce impacts on the easement. Monitored project activities and are in the process of reconciling issues resulting from the project.

Desert Tortoise Fencing

- ✓ Continued contracted work with Nevada Division of Forestry (NDF) to retrofit high priority roads with tortoise-proof mesh. As of April 1, 2008, NDF had completed a total of 36 miles along I-15 (from 93 turnoff going north) under this agreement.
- ✓ Renewed contract with American Fence to purchase an additional 20 miles of fencing material for this project.
- ✓ Completed maintenance and repair of tortoise-proof fencing around the Large Scale Translocation Site.

Public Information and Education

✓ Mojave Max Education Program – Continued work under contract with the Red Rock Canyon Interpretative Association (RRCIA) to administer the Mojave Max Education Program. RRCIA completed 12 school assemblies and reached more than 200 teachers and 5000 students.

- ✓ Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Video Project Continued contracted work with Partners in Conservation for the development and production of two videos targeting teen and pre-teen OHV use. Videos will use teen and pre-teen talent to better inform those target audiences. Videos will highlight responsible use and the "Respect, Protect and Enjoy our Desert" theme.
- ✓ Mojave Max Assembly Video Project Initiated contract with Joshua Tree Productions to write, develop and produce a video that will bring the Mojave Max Assembly to classrooms that are unable to get the live assembly each year.

Desert Tortoise Hotline and Pick-Up Service

- ✓ Operated the desert tortoise hotline and pick-up service with staff.
- ✓ Delivered a total of 67 tortoises to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at the Desert Tortoise Conservation Center:
 - o 37 surrendered pet desert tortoises
 - 11 stray pet desert tortoises found in urban areas
 - 4 stray pet tortoises or turtles that are not desert tortoises
 - o 14 tortoises of unknown origin
 - 1 wild tortoise
- ✓ Seating of the pet tortoise task force has been pushed back to allow for the selection of a facilitator to help convene and facilitate the process.

- ✓ Updated the Habitat Loss by Ecosystem and Land Use Trend Reports (see attachments)
