- Initiated development of inventory tracking database to track division assets, 60% complete.
- Initiated development of purchase order workflow in Case 360, 15% complete.
- Continued coordination with County Finance office and County Comptroller on the Desert Conservation Program's (DCP) transition to the Department of Comprehensive Planning.
- Continued process development for centralized fee collection of tortoise fees.

Wild Desert Tortoise Assistance Line

- The line logged 9 calls.
- Five wild tortoises were collected and transferred to the Desert Tortoise Conservation Center (DTCC). Four of the tortoises came from the solar construction site in the Energy Zone by the BCCE.
- One non-desert tortoise was picked up and taken to the DTCC.

Public Information and Education (PIE)

- Mojave Max Education Program Continued the contract with Red Rock Canyon Interpretive Association for educational programs at Clark County schools. Administered 12 Mojave Max Assembly presentations which reached 3,569 students. Mojave Max instructors visited 45 additional schools and reached a total of 4,810 students through the classroom program. Administered professional development course for teachers on March 17th and 24th. Seventeen teachers attended the training and became certified to teach the Mojave Max lessons at their sites.
- Outreach Events The Mojave Max mascot made appearances at six (6) community events where
 he reached approximately 2,050 people. Staff prepared and issued a new purchase order to SteveN-Kids to provide Mojave Max Mascot appearances at the Clark County Fair and other events
 during the month of April 2012.
- PIE SNPLMA R6 Funds We are currently completing close-out and final reporting for all R6 public information and education projects.
