MSHCP Background/Overview


 Provides compliance with federal Endangered Species Act





Mitigation Fees/Land Disturbance

- July 2010 to June 2011
 - 640.91 acres disturbed
 - \$347,737 revenues generated





Budget/Finance – SNPLMA funding

- Round 6
 - 40 cooperative agreements, 20 are complete
 - \$25 million awarded, \$18.9 million spent
 - ~76% complete (based on spending)

Round 8

- Three cooperative agreements, zero are complete
- \$4.2 million awarded, \$1.8 million spent
- ~43% complete (based on spending)

Round 12

- Two nominations submitted
- Executive Committee recommends funding both
- Awaiting Secretary of Interior decision



- 2011-2013 Implementation
 Plan and Budget
 - Prepared and approved by BCC and USFWS
- Compliance Reporting
 - 2009-2011 Biennium Progress Report
 - Due October 2011

Wild Desert Tortoise Assistance Line

 Successfully transitioned pick up of pet tortoises to the San Diego Zoo (December 2009)

Collected 31 desert tortoises since transition,

14 in last fiscal year





Desert Tortoise Fencing

- Since 1991:
 - ~\$4.1 million spent on fencing activities
 - 222 miles of new fencing installed
 - 202 miles of fencing retrofitted
- NDOT assuming monitoring and maintenance activities for fencing
- NDF Contract in place to conduct monitoring and repairs, as needed



Project and Contract Management

- 29 outsourced projects/contracts
 - 341 invoices received
 - 445 deliverables received
 - 42 change requests received
- 41 in-house projects/activities
- Three pre-award projects



Permit Amendment – completed to date

- Held Public Scoping meetings
- Initiated Environmental Impact Analysis
- Received recommendations report from Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)
- Analyzed Impacts
- Drafted chapters of MSHCP
- Completed Economic Analysis





Permit Amendment – next steps

- Meetings with permittees, stakeholders and CAC - ongoing
- Permittees are weighing options
 - Status quo (defer amendment)
 - Proceed with additional acres at additional cost
 - Proceed with additional acres and attempt to phase-in additional costs
