Endangered Species Act (ESA)



Endangered Species Act of 1973

“...to provide a means whereby the ecosystems upon which endangered species and threatened species depend may be conserved [and] to provide a program for the conservation of such ... species...”

- **Section 10(a)(1)(B) - Habitat Conservation Plans & Incidental Take Permit**

- A plan prepared by non-federal parties wishing to obtain permits for incidental take of threatened and endangered species
- Describes the anticipated effects of proposed take and how these effects will be minimized and mitigated

Regional Compliance



The Desert Conservation Program serves as the Administrator of the Clark County Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP) and incidental take permit

Permittees:

- City of Las Vegas
- City of North Las Vegas
- City of Henderson
- City of Mesquite
- City of Boulder City
- Clark County
- Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT)



Clark County MSHCP



- 30-year permit effective February 2001 – February 2031
- Take cannot exceed 145,000 acres
- Covers all non-federal land in Clark County
- Covers 78 species
 - Threatened
 - Desert Tortoise
 - Yellow-billed cuckoo
 - Endangered
 - Southwestern Willow Flycatcher
 - Mt. Charleston blue butterfly
- Permittees collect a \$550 per-acre disturbance fee to fund implementation
- Minimizes and mitigates the impacts of development by funding conservation actions; minimum required expenditure



Mitigation Actions

Non-discretionary items:

- BCCE
- Riparian property management
- Public information and education
- Tortoise fencing
- Wild Tortoise Assistance Line
- Adaptive Management Program
- General administration



Mitigation Actions

Discretionary items:

- Research
- Inventory
- Protective Measures
- Restoration and Enhancement
- Land Use Policies and Actions

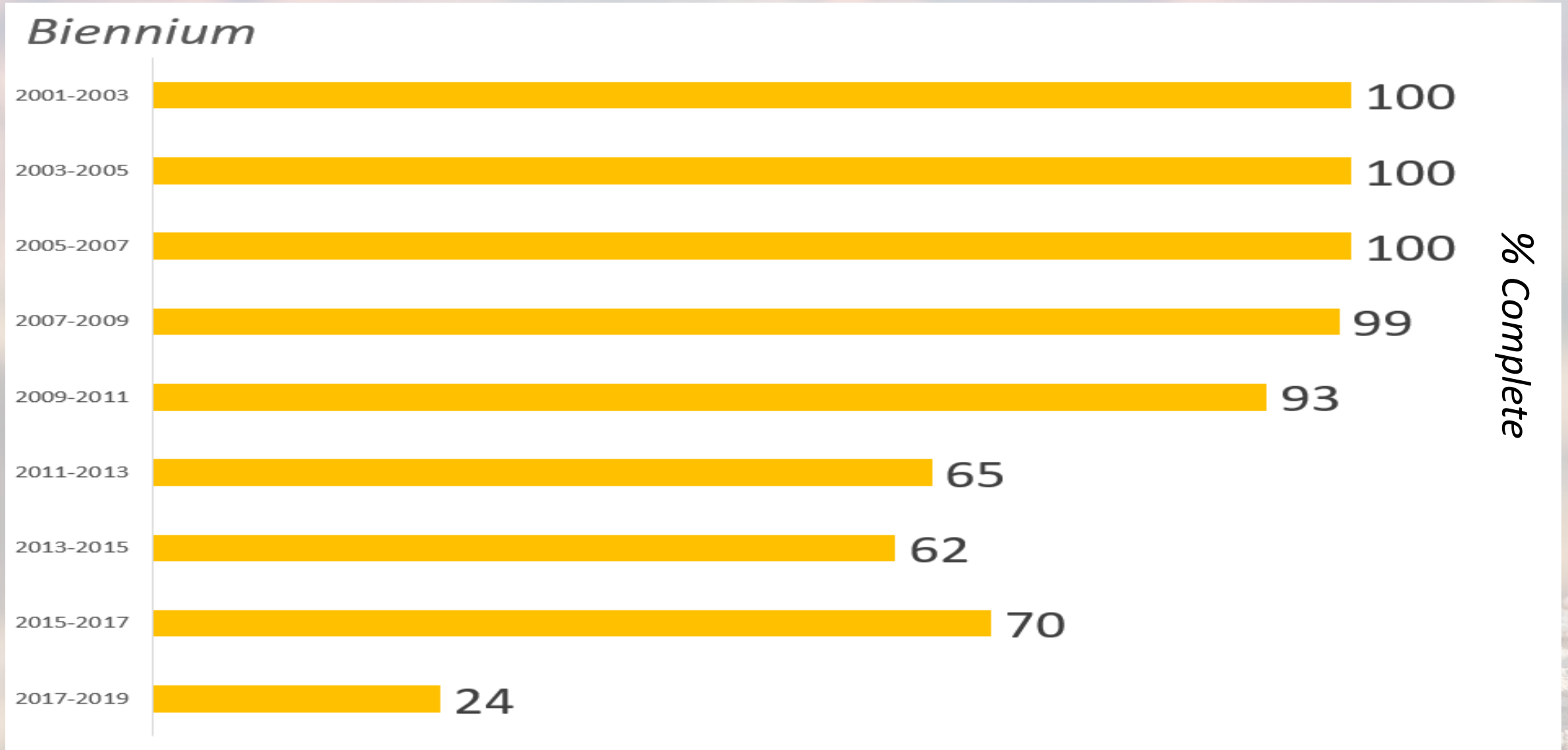


Implementation Plan & Budget (IPB)



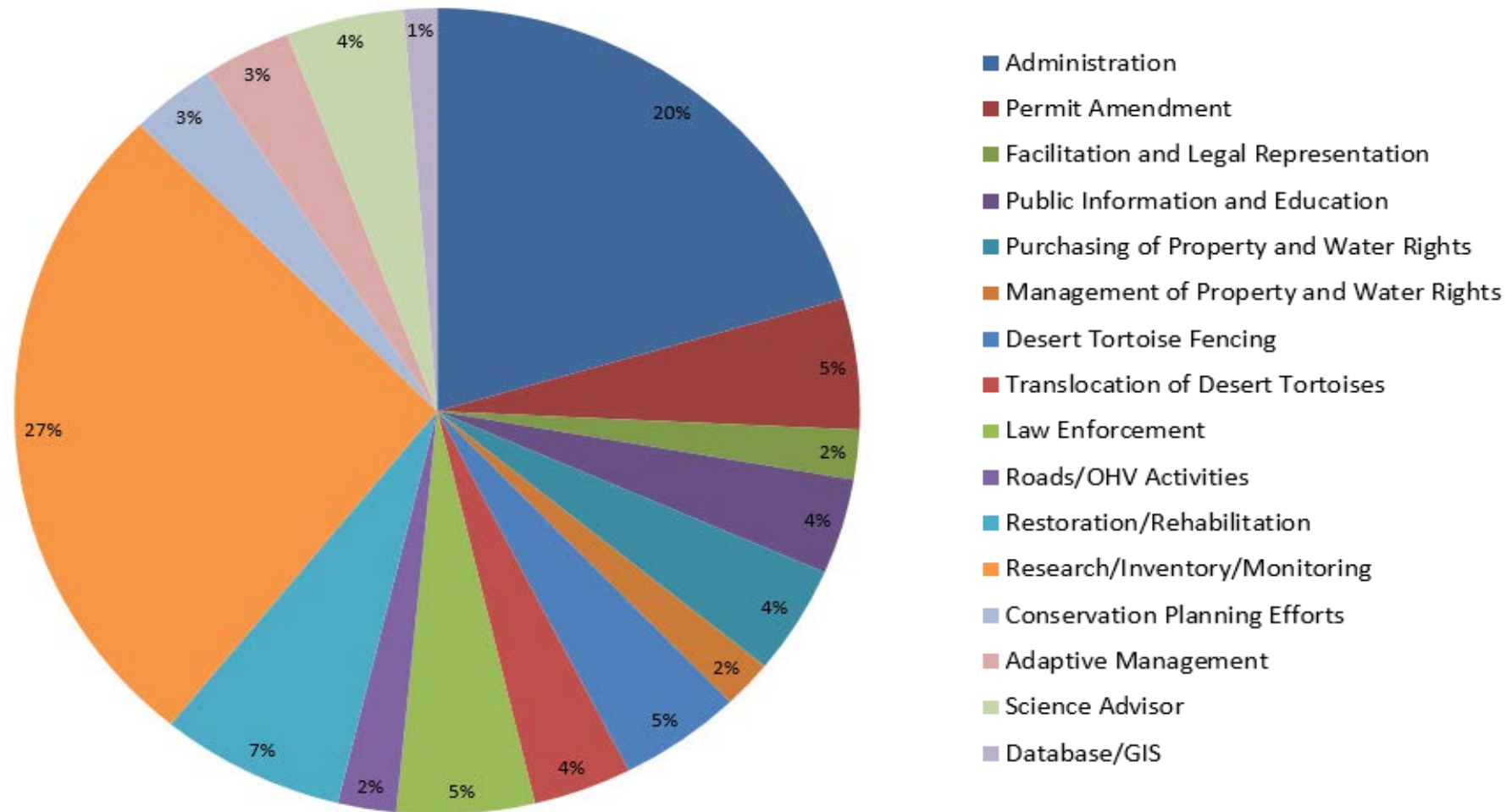
- Developed bi-annually (even numbered years)
- Identifies the mitigation actions to be funded each biennium
- Reviewed and recommended by:
 - Permittees
 - U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service
 - Science Advisor
 - Public
- Approved by Clark County Board of County Commissioners
- Draft 2019-2021 IPB will be available for public review and comment in October 2018

\$140 million from 2001 - Present

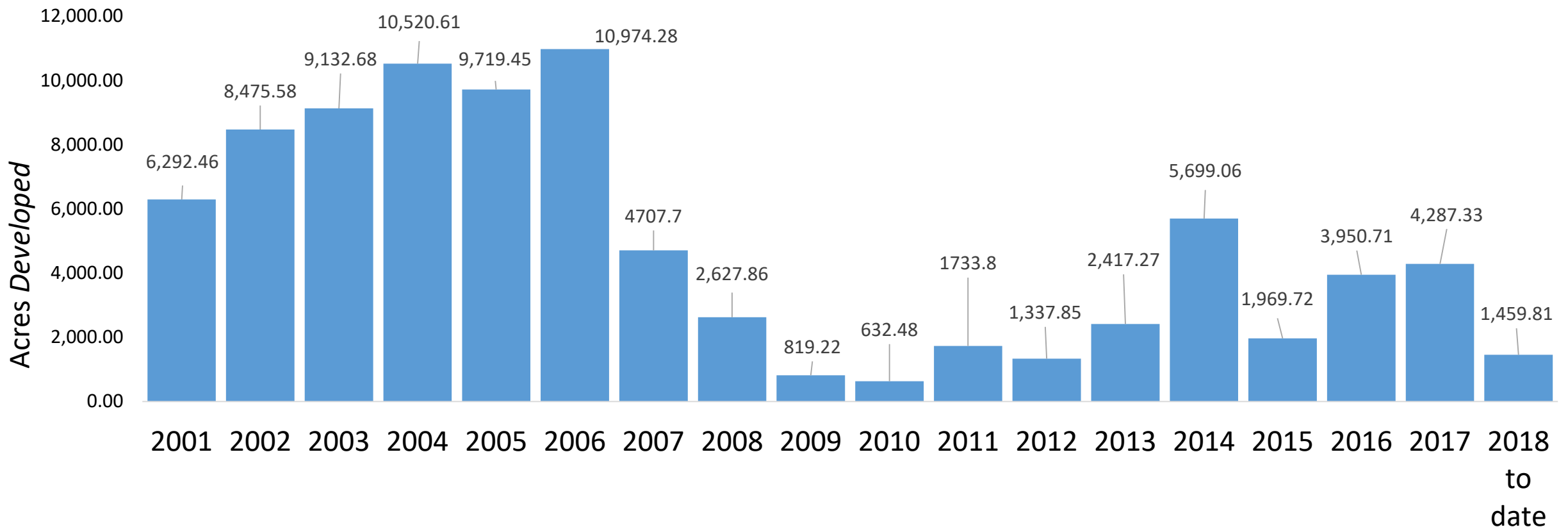


Land Disturbance & Fees



- 2016 – 3,950.71 acres disturbed; \$2.17 million
- 2017 – 4,287.33 acres disturbed; \$2.35 million
- 2018 – 1,459.81 acres disturbed; \$0.79 million

- 65,892.13 acres remain; \$47.25 million earned to date
- \$45,458,406 total SNPLMA Funds received since 2001



Project and Contract Management

From July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018

- Administered **59** contract projects and **104** purchase orders
- **193** Milestones achieved
- **304** Invoices received
- **326** deliverables received



Budget & Finance Oversight



- Drew down \$556,208 in SNPLMA funds
- Administered SNPLMA grant compliance
- Completed fiscal year close out
- Monitor and reconcile financials for 2017-2019 biennium
- Continued to reconcile the financial reporting database to SAP

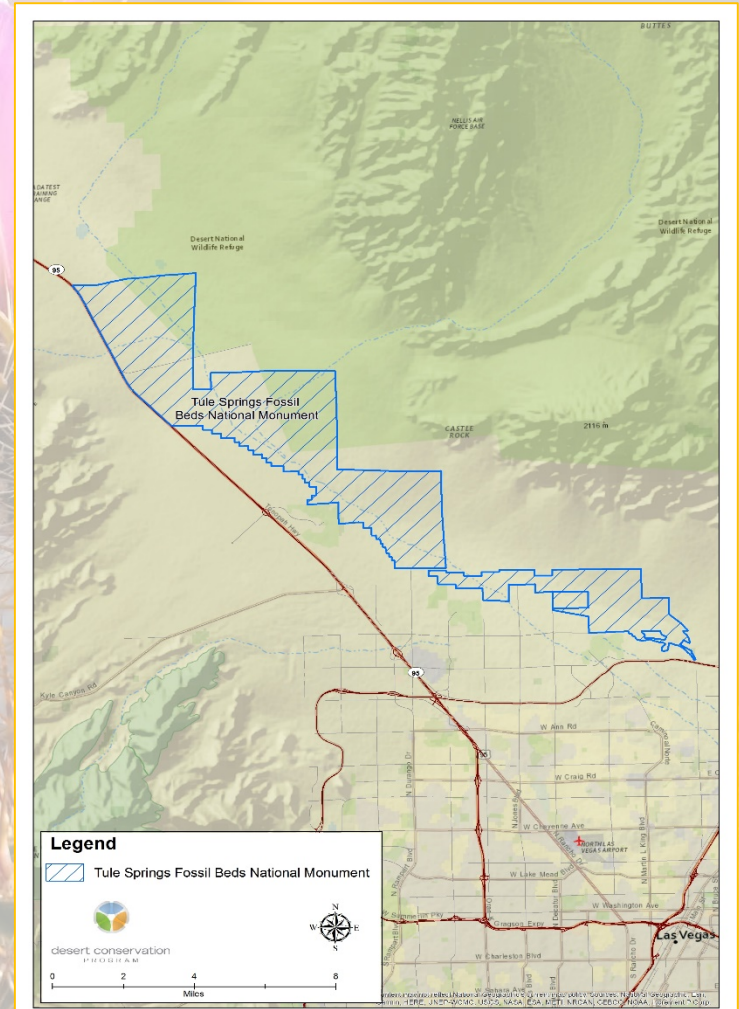
