The work for the above referenced project has been completed. Please see the attached for all project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

Partners in Conservation (PIC) recruited and trained volunteers from community organizations to make site visits to designated areas. Volunteers collected data on road conditions, damaged resources, vandalism and types of use observed. Data was collected and transferred to Clark County and BLM. The project goals were:

- Document road conditions
- Document baseline use of roads
- Document responses to reports of illegal use
- Assist the DCP with roads monitoring
- Increase public awareness of roads issues

The major accomplishment or findings of this project include:

PIC gathered and recorded road use data on public lands. In summary, data collected included:

- Total waypoints collected 545 points
- Total incident points collected 2,043 points
- Total distance of linear data collected 3,654 miles
- Total field work hours 3,757 hours
- Total distance driven for project 44,425 miles
- Total field reports taken 1,067 reports
