NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN of a public comment period and public hearing on the proposed *Second 10-Year Carbon Monoxide Limited Maintenance Plan: Las Vegas Valley Maintenance Area, Clark County, Nevada* (LMP). The Las Vegas Valley carbon monoxide (CO) nonattainment area was redesignated to attainment on September 27, 2010, following U.S. Environmental Protection Agency approval of Clark County's *Carbon Monoxide Redesignation Request and Maintenance Plan: Las Vegas Valley Nonattainment Area*. The 2008 maintenance plan detailed Clark County's attainment of the CO National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the control measures put in place to ensure the standard was maintained over the next 10 years (through 2020). Under Section 175A of the Clean Air Act, Clark County is required to submit a plan demonstrating attainment of the CO NAAQS for a second 10-year period following the expiration of the initial maintenance period. This Limited Maintenance Plan (LMP) serves as the second 10-year maintenance plan for the Las Vegas Valley CO maintenance area and demonstrates how the area will remain in attainment of the standard through 2030. If adopted, the LMP will be submitted to the state of Nevada and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a revision to the Nevada State Implementation Plan.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that a 30-day public comment period will begin on February 15, 2019, and end at 4:00 PM on March 18, 2019. The public may review and provide written comments on the proposed LMP during this period. The Board of County Commissioners will consider the proposed LMP, along with all written and any oral public comments, at a public hearing at 10:00 AM on May 7, 2019, in the Commission Chambers at the Clark County Government Center, 500 S. Grand Central Parkway, Las Vegas, NV.

Copies of the proposed LMP may be reviewed at the Clark County Department of Air Quality (DAQ), 4701 W. Russell Rd., Suite 200, Las Vegas, NV 89118, or on the DAQ website at <http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/airquality/Pages/default.aspx>. 
