RE: Submittal of Revisions to Motor Vehicle Emissions Budgets in Ozone Redesignation Request and Maintenance Plan: Clark County, Nevada

Dear Mr. Stoker:

On behalf of Governor Sandoval, as his appointed designee, this letter transmits to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) the *Revision to Motor Vehicle Emissions Budgets in Ozone Redesignation Request and Maintenance Plan: Clark County, Nevada* for the 1997 8-hour ozone standard. The plan is being submitted electronically to USEPA's State Electronic Collaboration System (SPeCS) for SIPs. The submittal may be accessed electronically at <http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/airquality/planning/Pages/StateImplementationPlans.aspx>. The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) requests that USEPA approve the revised Motor Vehicle Emissions Budgets (MVEBs) for emissions of volatile organic compounds and nitrogen oxides for the 2008 attainment year and to project those emissions outward to 2015 and 2022. Current MVEBs contained in the ozone resignation request and maintenance plan were developed using an outdated mobile emission model. The revised MVEBs use EPA's most up-to-date mobile emissions model, MOVES2014a.

The revisions to MVEBs were adopted by the Clark County Board of County Commissioners on October 16, 2018. Evidence of adoption, appropriate public notice and the participation process are included as Appendix B.
