PERMIT GUIDE

OPEN FLAME APPLIANCES

This guide is to assist in the permitting process for an operational permit to use open flame appliances including fire pits, torches, Bunsen burners, butane or other fuel cooking tops as in connection with assembly areas, dining areas, restaurants or drinking establishments per section 105.6.34 of the IFC. Open Flames are regulated per IFC Section 308.

Please Note:

- Pyrotechnics, permanent or temporary propane flame effects, fire performers, and consumer fireworks are covered by another permit type.

SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST:

The listed requirements in this guide are not intended to be all inclusive, nor do they entail a limit to the extent of the information, etc., which may be necessary to properly evaluate the submitted plans and documents. Provide all applicable information that pertains to your permit.

1. Property name, address, and location within the property.
2. A floor plan of the restaurant/event showing layout and location for each open flame device to be used. Include fire extinguisher locations.
3. For each different candle set up provide the following items.
 - Photographs of every candle assembly.
 - A detailed description of each item in the candle assembly including dimensions must be provided for each submittal. Reference CCFC 308.1.9.2 for information on candles, oil lamps and tea lights with regards to Flame and candle size, spillage, and materials.

Permit Guide: Open Flames Appliances, (cont'd)

- Information on the votive/vase/holder, the type of candle (standard wax, liquid, or self-extinguishing liquid) and other items included in these arrangements (plant or floral arrangements, linen skirting, statues, water, gel, rocks, etc.)
- A sample of each candle assembly for testing according to CCFC 308.3. See Appendix A for additional information.

PERMIT DURATION:

Candles and Open Flame Permits are annual renewable permits and are limited to a duration of one (1) year. A revision will need to be submitted if the candle / device is altered in any way.
