- VI. Receive the Director's Report on the Activities of the Department of Juvenile Justice Services**
 - a. Budget/Personnel Update**
 - i.** Finalization of the 2019 budget will be complete in the next couple weeks when legislation finishes. The budget remains flat for DJJS.
 - ii.** Our JPO II Academy is scheduled to begin July first with 11 cadets, one training for the Nye County. We will have a third Academy begin later in the year.
 - b. Legislature –** The Governor has 10 days remaining to sign bills. Below are some of the current bills we are monitoring with new updates in grey highlights.
 - i.** AB168-Revises provisions governing the discipline of pupils. Requires a school to provide a plan of action based on restorative justice before suspending or expelling a student. The bill passed though we have not seen the final amendments.
 - ii.** AB322-Establishes provisions relating to juvenile assessment center. We received \$3 million to maintain existing Harbor services as well as expanding the Harbor to other areas of the community. We are looking at available property in areas that need it most.
 - iii.** SB242-Revises provisions relating to peace officers. Awaiting to view final language and see how it will effect DJJS.
 - iv.** AB449-Directs the Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice to conduct a study relating to juvenile detention in this State. DJJS always welcomes outside parties to assess our practices and procedures. We are always wanting to improve and streamline processes for our clients when possible. Our focus continues to be on diversion from DJJS for youth, offering services while youth are in our care, rehabilitation, vocational training, etc. Outside recommendations can only assist us with reaching our goals.
 - c. Juvenile Detention Reform**

- i. YLS training is scheduled to begin in August. Once this tool is being utilized, it will limit the discretion that probation officers now have and focus on the risk the youth imposes on the community. This will make probation orders more consistent and and fair for all youth.
 - ii. There has been a 25% decrease in referrals to DJJS since starting the School Justice Partnership.
 - iii. DJJS has received audit results from SMYC being audited for PREA (Prison Rape Elimination Act). We are reviewing results now and plan to have our Detention center audited next. We also expect group homes to be audited in the next few years.
 - d. **Juvenile Justice Programming**
 - i. Youth have now moved into the new Spring Mountain Residential Center. There are 12 beds: With four additional beds are used for SMYC youth on the weekend program. We still plan to renovate the old home for girls.
 - ii. Please check out a Spring Mountain Youth Camp Golden Eagles game this coming season! The youth love having support. Coach Aaron Masden won Football Coach of the year for the State of Nevada! The Golden Eagles have won the State championship 2 times in the last few years! This is a huge accomplishment as Coach Masden only has limited time with his players before they leave the mountain. A lot of the youth have never played football before. The schedule will always be listed in our minutes.
 - iii. Please keep an eye out for the invite to our annual SMYC Forestry picnic. It will be on August 2nd, 2019. More to come!
 - e. **The Harbor Update** – The Harbor has now serviced over 9,000 youth. With legislation and additional funding, we plan to open 2-3 additional Harbor locations. We are looking in the North Las Vegas, Southwest and old Henderson areas. Mr. Martin is still working on getting probation officers placed in high schools in the community. Right now we are looking at Mojave, Cheyenne, Legacy and Canyon Springs high schools to participate.

VII. CAC Strategic Goals

- a. **Increase programming to improve client outcomes, using evidence based practices and measuring performance**
- b. **Reduce disproportionate minority contact through the use of targeted strategies and programs**
- c. **Post juvenile justice transitional Improve facilities to provide increased security and increased rehabilitative and vocational opportunities**
 - i. Mr. Whelihan is meeting with CCSO today and continues to work with Work Force Connections to create vocational programming for youth. This will create an easier path for youth to have a trade, gain certificates at an earlier age, or even continuing their education.
 - ii. Before the Family Courthouse goes under construction, there will be a full assessment done on all agencies within to determine whether they will have and what space will be allocated for them. Because of the earth under the Courthouse, they cannot build more than 3 stories.
 - iii. SMYC is researching more vocational programs that can be done indoors during snow season. If we were able to get funding for a gym, we would be able to host tournaments and the youth and team would not have to travel for practices and all games.
