Nevada CLE

What is CLE?

CLE stands for Continuing Legal Education. The State Bar of Nevada's CLE Board was established under NSC Rules 205-215 to accredit continuing legal education providers, certify educational programs available for credit, and to oversee and facilitate attorney compliance with annual requirements.

Annual Requirements

Attorneys subject to annual CLE requirements* must complete 13 credit hours by December 31st annually:

- 10 general credits
- 2 ethics credits
- 1 credit in the area of substance abuse, addictive disorders and/or mental health issues that impair professional competence

*Unless exempt under Supreme Court Rule 214.

*Newly admitted attorneys are exempt from the CLE credit hour requirement for the remainder of the calendar year in which they are admitted and for the next full calendar year. Instead of earning CLE credits, a newly admitted attorney must enroll in the Transitioning into Practice (TIP) program.

Compliance Deadlines

December 31: Complete annual CLE requirements and submit an Affirmation of Attendance.

January 1: Extension fee period.

March 1: Extension deadline to complete annual CLE requirements and submit an Affirmation of Attendance.

CLE credit hours are typically offered in a variety of formats including: in-person., live webcast, on-demand online, Video broadcast replays, and self-study to name a few.
