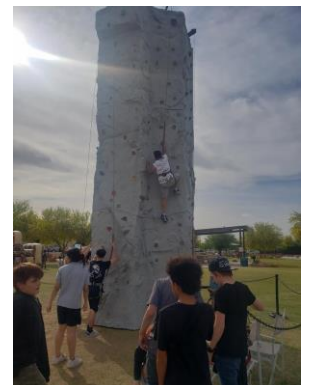


Celebration

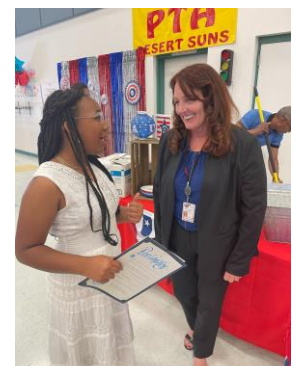

DON'T RISK IT!

Getting caught using illegal fireworks could result in big fines.



The use of illegal fireworks in local neighborhoods over the July 4th holiday poses serious public safety risks. Illegal fireworks cause fires, injuries and air pollution, and are a source of thousands of noise and nuisance complaints from seniors, pet owners and people suffering from post-traumatic stress. Offenders caught using illegal fireworks in Clark County face a minimum \$500 fine. Fines of up to \$10,000 can be imposed for large amounts of illegal fireworks found within our community.

Ser sorprendido con fuegos artificiales ilegales podría resultar en grandes multas.



El uso ilegal de fuegos artificiales en zonas residenciales durante las festividades del 4 de julio representa serios riesgos para la salud pública. Los fuegos artificiales provocan incendios, lesiones y contaminan el aire, además de que a raíz de ello se reciben miles de quejas por ruido y molestias por parte de personas de la tercera edad, personas con mascotas y personas que padecen de estrés postraumático. Los infractores que sean sorprendidos usando fuegos artificiales dentro del condado Clark serán multados con \$500 (sic). Dichas multas podrán ascender hasta \$10,000 si se encuentran grandes cantidades de fuegos artificiales en nuestra comunidad.
