Debbie Burgos - (Item 12) Ross is currently at 70% completion on the loop and has a lot of support

Issue 7 - there are talks of the wind solar being proposed again but has not received any communication from BLM. Kenny Thatcher (Item 7) - believes they have until August to receive approval.

Debbie Burgos read Ross Williams comment into the record (for Item 21). A copy of this comment will be provided with the minutes. Debbie encouraged folks to reach out to Senator Catherine Cortez-Masto's Office and to make sure that they include that it's in regard to the federal lands bill. Mike Frye - is there anything the committee can do to make an impact beyond what's already been done? What are their next steps? Commissioner Kirkpatrick - feels like items have added back to the bill which supports OHV use. OHV use will continue to be supported in Ivanpah as long as there is no airport. In the meantime, they can continue to look at other pieces of land to establish for OHV use. Debbie Burgos - has been in contact with Zach in Catherine Cortez Masto's Office and is encouraging members and the public to continue to reach out in support of OHV use on public lands. Debbie will be meeting with her office soon with a group to discuss this in great detail. Kenny Thatcher - asking the commissioners about the wilderness and conservation easements. He's under the impression that there has to be a certain percentage of conservation areas according to the amount of acreage sold off or disposed of? Is there a way to designate a certain portion to OHV use? Marilyn Kirpatrick - the 2 for 1 was designated for Gold Butte and Tule Springs to designate land for OHV use. The committee can ask Senator Masto's office to add an outdoor recreation component to her bill. Debbie Burgos - clarified that the OHV language was added back to the bill.

Debbie Burgos – extended a big thank you to Sue Baker for her hard work over the years. Sue Baker has retired and has stepped down from the board. Mike Frye - the new permit process with COVID can be a subject to discuss on the next agenda.

Southern Nevada Economic Development and Conservation Act (SNEDCA) Points:

1. There is not one stakeholder endorsement listed from recreational/land access interests. There is no representation from any OHV interest despite a Forest Service estimate that 23.9% of Nevada's population engages in OHV use.
2. The Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA) created a "multiple use mandate" which specifically includes recreation and whereby public lands must be used in a *balanced* combination. In SNEDCA, only 4 areas (Laughlin, Nelson Hills, Sandy Valley, and Logandale) totaling 121,856 acres, or 2.4% of the area of Clark County, are designated for OHV use. Put together, these areas would measure only 13.8 x 13.8 miles. Previously, OHV users could recreate on any existing road, trail, or dry wash. Therefore, this is a drastic reduction in access and recreation where development and environmental areas are being significantly increased. That is not balance.
3. All areas (even OHV designated areas) will require designated routes for legal operation. There is no indication, prior to passage, which routes will be designated therefore the public cannot comment on this bill with any meaningful knowledge of the full effect of its enactment.
4. There is a high amount of wilderness proposed on land that is already protected, such the Desert National Wildlife Refuge. Why? Due to its "non-mechanized" rule, a wilderness designation prohibits any transportation other than on motorized corridors (which tend to be rare), or on horseback or on foot. Bicycles are prohibited. Therefore, designating an area as wilderness will render it mostly inaccessible for all practical purposes. While this is appropriate for areas like Mt. Charleston, which is conducive to hiking, it is not appropriate for large swaths of previously disturbed desert land surrounding a major urban environment.
5. There is every indication that the expanding recreational needs of a growing population in Clark County will be inhibited by SNEDCA due to restricted access to the surrounding back country in Clark County. Proposed wilderness areas in SNEDCA total 1,639,422 acres, or 31.7% of the total area of Clark County, or 13.5 x the amount of OHV designated areas. OHV designations facilitate back country access for the general population, wilderness designations prohibit access to all but the heartiest of people who can ride a horse or hike great distances, which is a very small group.
6. There would be 353,716 acres of Special Management Areas (SMAs) created by this legislation. Some of them are located in current popular OHV recreational areas such as the Jean Dry Lake. Routes would have to be designated to allow for casual OHV use, and there could be NO new routes created after passage of SNEDCA. Therefore, going forward in SMAs, there would only be a mechanism for eliminating routes (which provide access), new ones could not be created.

7. In general, the concerns outlined above with respect to OHV use and access to the Clark County back country will be present whether or not SNEDCA is enacted. The current key issue for those wanting to maintain the ability to access and recreate in the public lands surrounding Clark County is the creation of designated routes. Without them, access to our Southern Nevada outdoors is threatened. As the first major route designation project to address the problem of diminishing recreational opportunities in Clark County, the Las Vegas Valley Loop Trail (LVVLT) project was created to guarantee access to our main outdoor points of interest in perpetuity. I have proposed to Sen. Cortez-Masto's office to include the LVVLT project into SNEDCA. This would streamline the implementation and ensure that public access to public lands is not cut off in Clark County. I have requested shape files from Sen. Cortez-Masto's office and have yet to receive them. When they are provided, I will be able to analyze SNEDCA to see what impact it has on the LVVLT.
