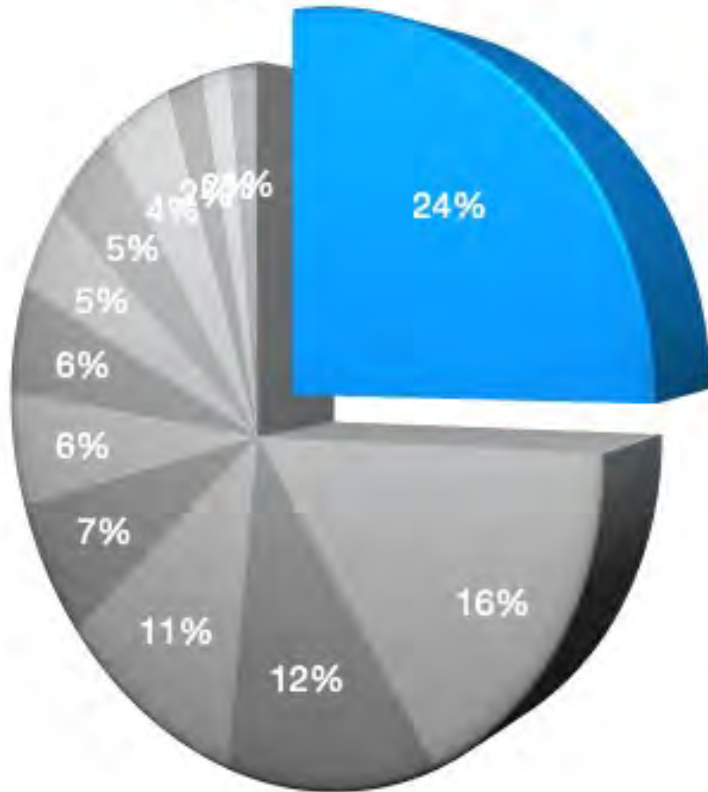

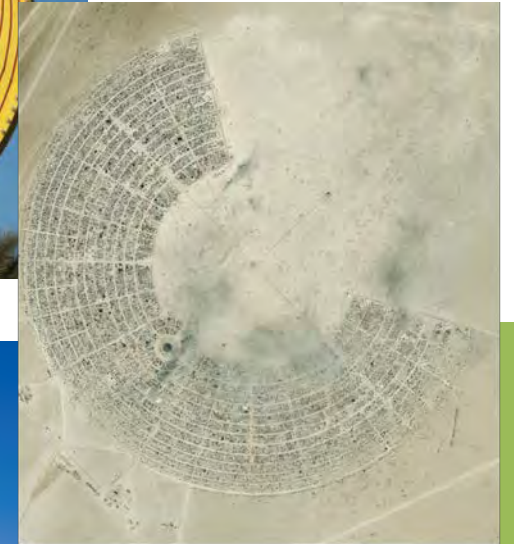

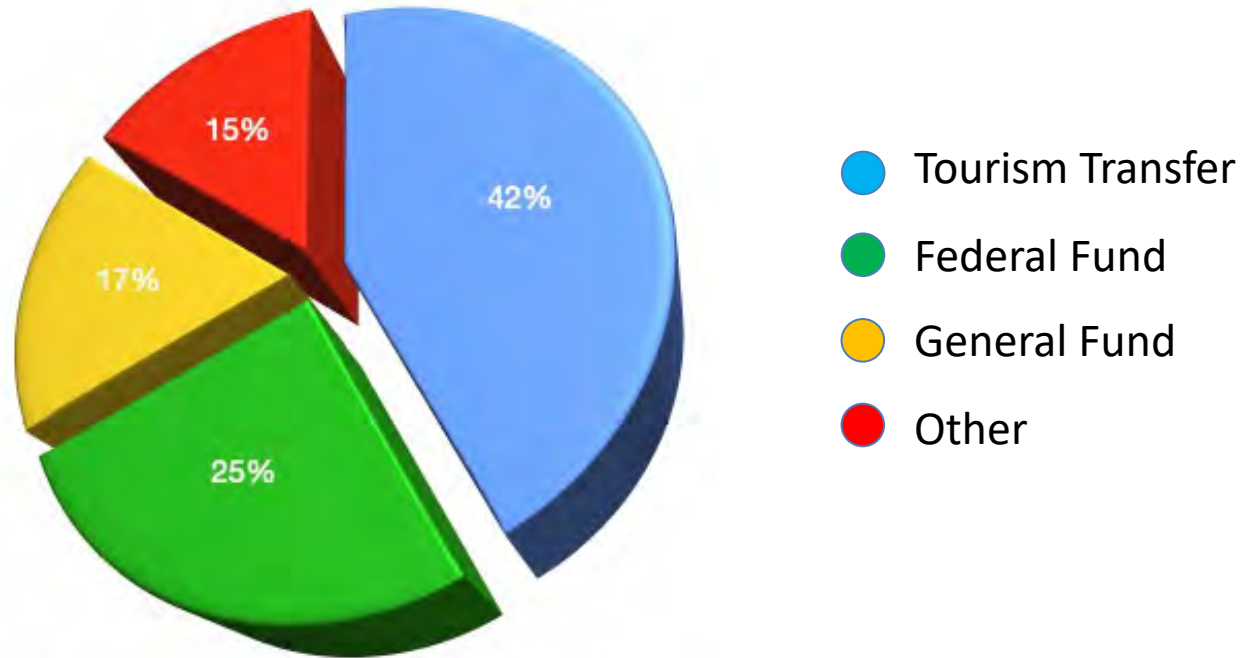
Celebrating **56 years**, the Nevada Arts Council was established as a **state agency in 1967**.

2. The practice, enjoyment and impact of the arts are of **increasing importance to the economic vitality of communities in this state**.
3. Residents of this state desire **increased opportunity to view, enjoy or participate in the performing, literary, visual and folk arts**.
4. To this end, it is the policy of the State of Nevada to join with institutions and professional organizations concerned with the arts to **ensure that the role of the arts in the life of the communities of the State will continue to grow and play an ever-increasing part in the cultural development and educational experience of the residents of the State of Nevada**.

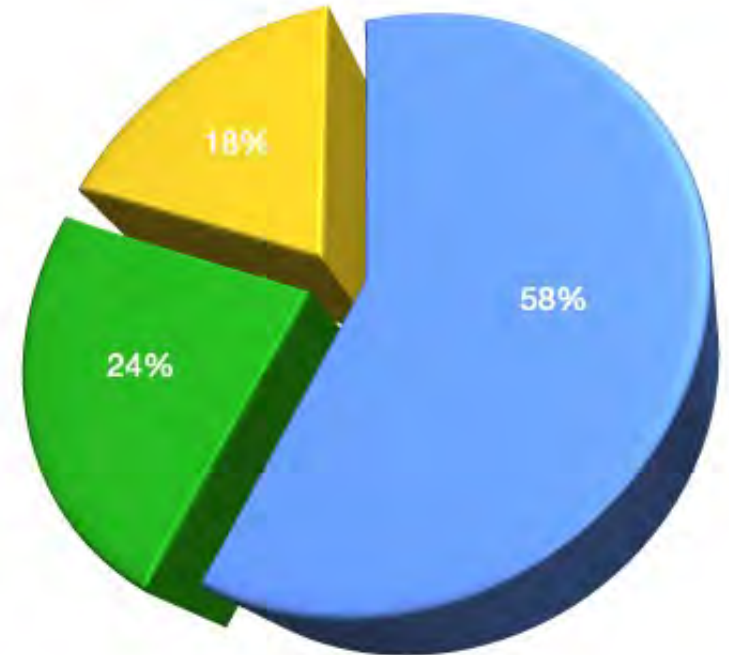

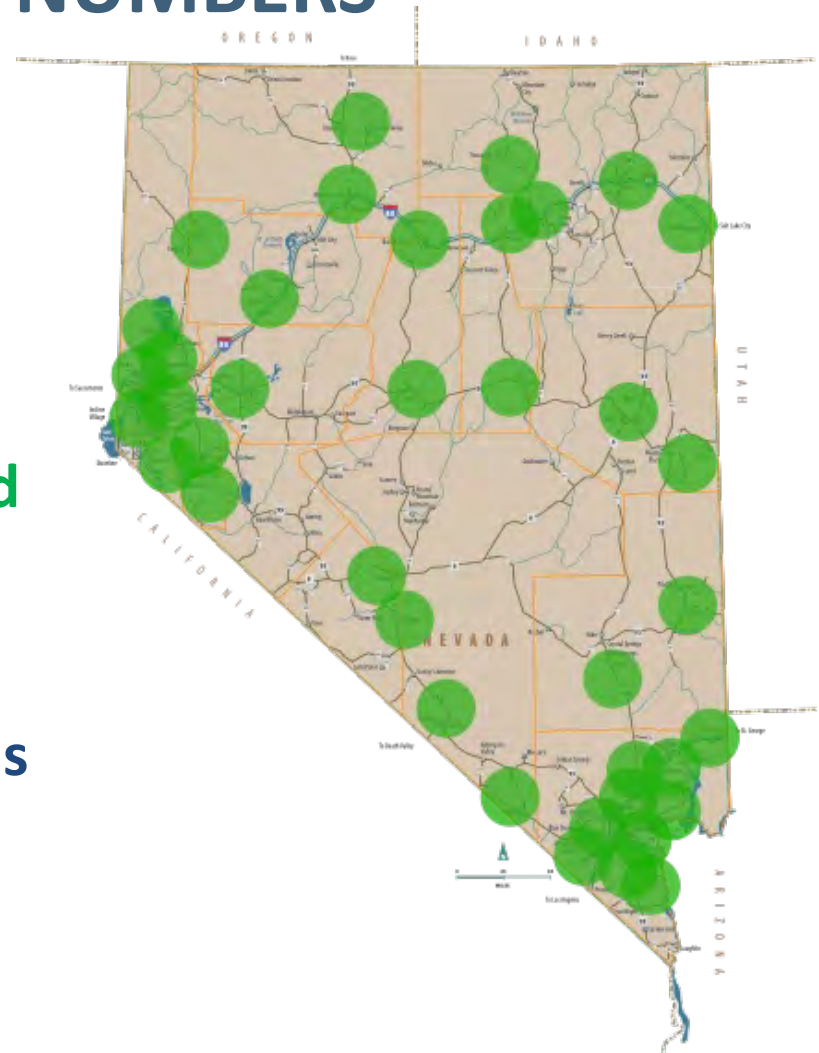

## INDIVIDUALS

- Must be at least 21 years old
- Must be a current Nevada resident and have been in residence for at least one year prior to the date the grant application is submitted
- Must be a U.S. citizen or have legal permanent resident status
- Must not be enrolled as a degree-seeking student
- Current Nevada Arts Council staff members, board members, and immediate family members or individuals sharing the household of current staff or board members are not eligible for Nevada Arts Council grants.

### NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

- Must have federal tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (Fiscal Agents are not accepted in FY22)
- Must have active incorporation status with the Nevada Secretary of State showing evidence of good standing at the time of application.
- Must have a UEI number (replacing DUNS number)\*



### PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS

- **GOVERNMENT AGENCIES** (including federally recognized tribes): Agencies that exist within the same governmental entity are eligible to apply independently when they have different/distinct mission statements and their own separate advisory boards. Multiple departments/facilities within one agency may not apply independently.
- **COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES:** Limited to no more than one grant to the same academic department per fiscal year. Projects must serve a broad community outside the institution and generate area-wide arts involvement. Grants may not support the institution's internal programs
- **PUBLIC SCHOOLS/LIBRARIES:** Individual schools and libraries within the same district/system may apply independently as long as they have their own budget and facility

Ainsley Osawa is an artist from Las Vegas, Nevada currently specializing in drawing. He spent a lot of time growing up in West Las Vegas and frequented the Andre Agassi Boys and Girls club and the West Las Vegas Arts Center. He picked up drawing at the Boys and Girls Club and dove further into the arts at WLVAC, performing with their Performance Ensemble. During that period, Osawa met many influential artists and community leaders like Walter Mason, a spoken word and African-American literature aficionado. Some of the inspiration for this exhibition came from what he learned and experienced at the West Las Vegas Arts Center. The rest of inspiration lies within one of his favorite animals, cats! You'll see them scattered throughout some of the pieces in this exhibition.

The SOLO SERIES Juried Exhibition open call provides four local, emerging, and under-recognized artists who currently live, formerly lived, and/or have a connection to the Historic Westside community in Las Vegas. Each of the four selected artists will have the opportunity to present an exhibition at the Pearson Gallery for at least 7 weeks between September 2022 to May 2023. In addition, each artist is required to teach a workshop in relation to their exhibit. Each artist will be selected by a blind jury, which consists of members who also have a connection to the Historic Westside community.

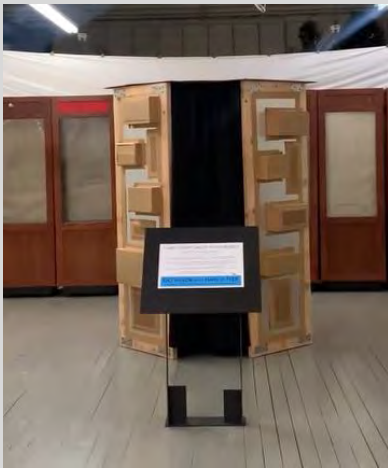

# Youth Public Arts Education

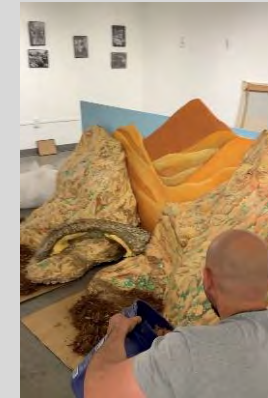

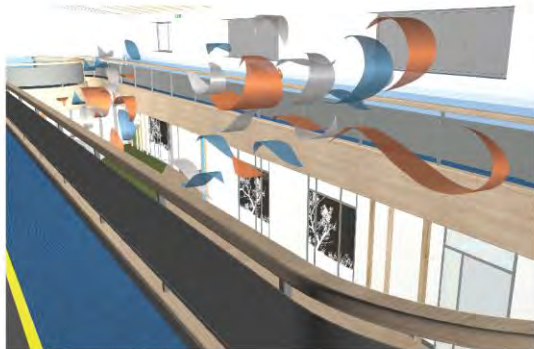

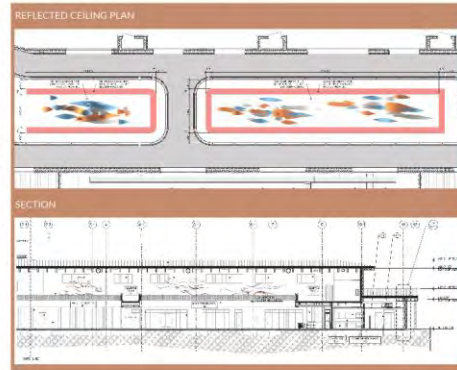
Bringing nature indoors, abstract elements curl and dance through the main circulation area to compose Desert Winds. Copper, silver, and blue finishes mirror the color palette of the surrounding landscape as well as the finishes of the building.

"When I think of Las Vegas and the surrounding landscape, I remember the wind, sloping down from the mountains and keeping the city bathed in near constant motion. My proposed sculpture is one of 'Desert Winds,' with abstracted and curled gusts weaving down the main corridor.

The shapes will lend themselves to different interpretations, such as clouds or waves, giving each viewer the opportunity to create their own narrative."

Dimensions: Three sculpture clusters, each approx. 25' L x 8'W x 10'H. Total: 75'L x 8'W x 10'

Materials: Powder coated or anodized perforated aluminum, stainless steel cable, stainless steel hardware.
