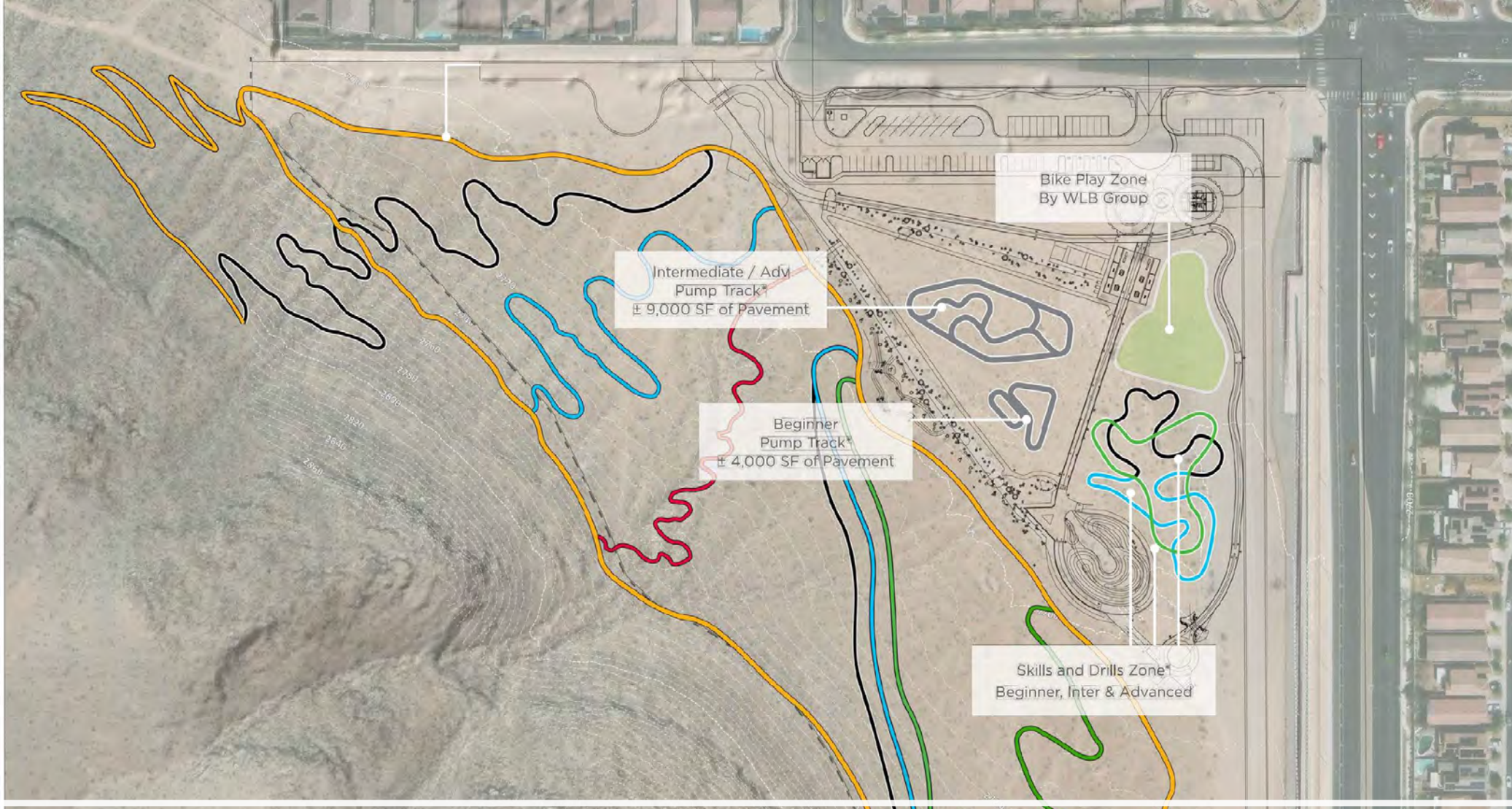

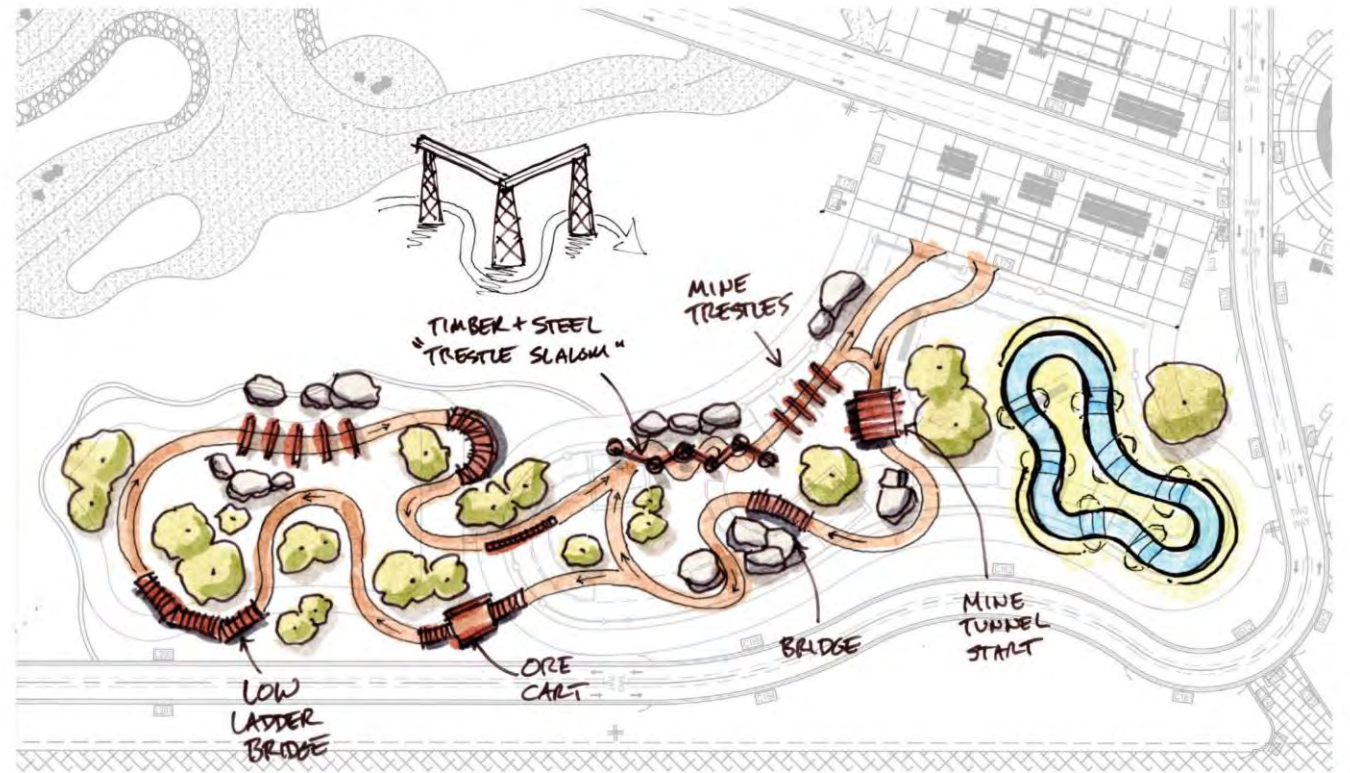

Tot Balance Bike Track + Skills Area -- Concept Sketch

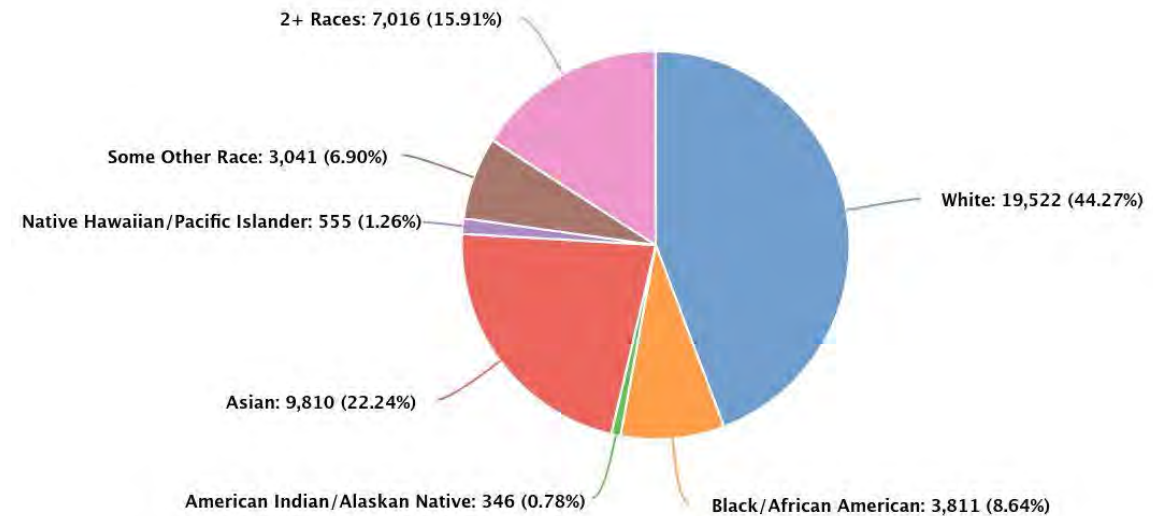

WOMEN'S HISTORY

- **Women's history** is the study of the role that women have played in history and the methods required to do so. It includes the study of the history of the growth of woman's rights throughout recorded history, personal achievements over a period of time, the examination of individual and groups of women of historical significance, and the effect that historical events have had on women. Inherent in the study of women's history is the belief that more traditional recordings of history have minimized or ignored the contributions of women to different fields and the effect that historical events had on women as a whole; in this respect, women's history is often a form of historical revisionism, seeking to challenge or expand the traditional historical consensus.

The Clark County Fair had its beginning back in 1965. Known as the Moapa Valley Fair, it was held at the Overton Community Center. Compared to the present-day fair, this first fair was small but, it had all the flavor and elements of a good old county fair. From this simple beginning, the Moapa Valley Fair became an annual event. Each year new attractions were added, such as a carnival midway, junior livestock show, and a rodeo. Now known as the Clark County Fair & Rodeo, the event has grown to receiving 80,000 visitors every spring. We encourage artists to submit work that digs into crafts such as quilting, sewing, pottery, beading, and leatherworking. Artists should also look at the aesthetics of the fair for inspiration; Ferris wheels, rodeos, kettle corn, and barbershop quartets are all common county fair visuals. One of our partners in this event is 4-H Youth Development where they teach children about leadership, citizenship, and life skills so anything educational and informational will also help make an impact for this open call. This exhibition not only honors the legacy and culture of our own county fair, but that of county fairs in general! Remember reading or watching Charlotte's Web? That's what we're looking for!
