'Remember Music Festival' to Raise Funds for 1 October Memorial

Media Invited to Get Setup Video, Interviews on Sept. 30

The Country Strong Project and Stoney's Rockin' Country will host the Remember Music Festival on **Saturday, Oct. 1**, at the Clark County Government Center's Amphitheater in commemoration of the fifth anniversary of the shooting and to support the 1 October memorial.

The Texas-based country music group Midland will headline the festival. Other artists include Dylan Schneider, Drew Green, Meghan Patrick, Walker Montgomery and Seth Ennis. Tickets are on sale through Eventbrite on the festival's website at www.remembermusicfest.com. Clark County's outdoor amphitheater is located at 500 S. Grand Central Parkway in downtown Las Vegas. Gates open to the public at 1 p.m. on Oct. 1, with live music starting at 2 p.m. and scheduled to go through the evening. Clark County is working with The Country Strong Project, Stoney's, the Vegas Strong Resiliency Center and other partners to support the event.

The Country Strong Project is a group of survivors who have hosted an annual reunion event in Las Vegas each year since the shooting that occurred at the Route 91 Harvest Festival on Oct. 1, 2017. This is the first year organizers are hosting an event that is open to the public. Attendees at previous gatherings have been limited to those who attended the Route 91 concert, first responders and family members of victims. Like this year's festival, past events have included bands and vendors, as well as support from Vegas Strong Resiliency Center staff. Organizers donated ticket sale profits from past events to families of victims or their designated charities. The proceeds from the festival will support the permanent memorial that Clark County's 1 October Memorial Committee is working to create with ongoing community engagement.
