### **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

#### Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

During the 2015 Program Year, 330 units of affordable housing were completed including 203 units of newly constructed rental housing, 115 units of rental housing rehabilitation, 9 first time homebuyers and 3 single family rehabilitation projects. An additional 99 homeless households were assisted with rental assistance.

Clark County, North Las Vegas and Boulder City used Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds and Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Service funds to assist 6,468 homeless persons with services during the 2015 Program Year.

The final projects in the Clark County FY 2010-2014 CDBG Capital Improvement Plan were completed. The Opportunity Village Sean's Park project completed construction and served over 2,000 developmentally and physically disabled people in their first 6 weeks of operation. The Rainbow Dream Academy parking lot expansion was completed in September 2016.

The Clark County FY 2015-2019 CDBG Capital Improvement Plan was well underway with Catholic Charities Food Facilities Expansion and Consolidation project scheduled to be completed in October 2016. Accessible Space, Inc. completed the improvements to Casa Norte, a supportive living facility for people with traumatic brain injuries. The environmental eeviews were completed on the majority of the county capital projects and the projects are moving forward on design. Nevada Partners Workforce Center Expansion has completed its design and is prepared to go to the North Las Vegas Planning Department for review. Construction is scheduled to begin in November 2016.

The City of North Las Vegas Public Works Department replaced certain sidewalk concrete curb, gutters and spandrells in an area generally in the Highland Village, Highland Heights, Aspen Hills, Regal Estates, Valley View Estates, and parts of the industrial corridor contiguous to Valley View Estates. The Project is currently 90% complete and installed 64 ramps and tactile warning panels along with 47 spandrells.

Boulder City amended its 5-Year CDBG CIP Plan to remove the Industrial Road Sidewalk Project and move all of the funding into the street improvements in the Lakeview Addition to include the total reconstruction of Pyramid Lane, a 70-year old road, which will provide vehicle access

to the parking lot for the Lakeview Park, another CDBG funded project. Other roads/right-of-way within the Lakeview Addition will be reconstructed including the relocation of obstructions (hydrants, signs, etc.), undergrounding of utilities, and provision of sidewalks and street lights.

The County CDBG Consortium also provided funds to various non-profit groups that provide public services, such as respite services and services for the disabled. According to the FY 2015 beneficiary reports, Clark County CDBG non-homeless Consortium funds assisted 659 unduplicated people and households during the reporting period.

Assess how the jurisdiction's use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

North Las Vegas used CDBG funds to address their infrastructure improvement needs for ADA sidewalks and water bolstering through

replacement of old water lines. These projects help to ensure that residents of low/mod income areas have access to sanitary water with good pressure and improved access for people with disabilities. North Las Vegas is considering changing their Homeowner Housing Rehabilitation program which has resulted in a lower number of households assisted in FY 2015.

Clark County completed construction on the Opportunity Village Sean's Park project which is providing essential recreational and training opportunities for people with intellectual and physical disabilities. Catholic Charities is nearing completion on the CDBG funded Kitchen Consolidation and Expansion which will allow them to better serve the thousands of homeless people who eat in their Lied Dining Center every day and the hundreds of senior citizens who receive Meals on Wheels to help them remain independent and in their own homes.

### Narrative

The Boulder Highway Revitalization Area will include two multifamily housing developments and 2 service buildings, one for Boys and Girls Clubs and one for Lutheran Social Services. Boulder Pines I Apartments are under construction receiving HOME funds of \$1 million. The Boys and Girls Clubs clubhouse and Lutheran Social Service building are scheduled to begin construction in December 2016. The campus will also include Boulder Pines II Apartments. No funds were expended in FY 2015 with the

majority of billing expected in FY 2016.

The North Las Vegas Choice Neighborhood completed an amendment identifying the location for the Zion Community Garden which will be located at 2108 Revere Street. They allocated \$138,000 in the FY 2015 Action Plan for this activity and are moving another \$50,000 into the project through a substantial amendment. North Las Vegas also assisted with design costs for the Nevada Partners Workforce Center Expansion, located in the Choice Neighborhood. CDBG funds are also allocated for a water bolstering project and for ADA sidewalk improvements in the Choice Neighborhood.

### Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

State and Federal HOME and Low Income Housing Trust Funds (LIHTF) of \$5.6 million invested in the Clark County HOME Consortium yielded \$21.4 million in leveraged money from Low Income Housing Tax Credits, private grants, private loans, and owner cash contributions. HOME matching requirements were satisfied through the expenditures outlined below in the HOME Match Fiscal Year Summary. All match amounts were from the Low Income Housing Trust Funds allocated by the State of Nevada Housing Division.

ESG funds were matched 1:1 through a variety of sources including Outside Agency Grants funds from Clark County, Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds, Community Services Block Grant funds, a laundry list of State of Nevada funding including VAWA, SAMSHA, and private donors and foundations. ESG subrecipients provide a list of matched resources to ESG staff to ensure compliance with this requirement.

## Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The difference between goals and outcomes reflects the time lag between the allocation of funds for affordable housing development and the actual construction and completion of units. In addition, Clark County HOME Consortium receives State HOME and Low Income Housing Trust Funds which are responsible for many affordable housing units produced but not counted above as they are not Federal HOME funded projects. Clark County HOME Consortium is on track to produce the 2000 units identified in its strategic plan. In addition to the units completed this year, another 1,000 units are either under construction or will soon be under construction including Agate II Senior Apartments, Madison Palms Senior Apartments, Donna Louise Family Apartments, Casa Oliva, Boulder Pines I & II, Veterans Supportive Housing, Arroyo Pines, Russell III, and Tenaya Senior Apartments.

Further, the county has funded the rehabilitation of the 221-unit Summerhill Apartments and the 159unit Sierra Pointe Apartments in an effort to ensure their long-term viability as quality affordable housing.

The Clark County HOME Consortium will continue to focus its efforts on the production of affordable multifamily housing as the most effective way to meet the housing needs of people at 50% area median income and below.

#### Narrative Information

CDBG funds, when used for housing, are primarily for homeowner emergency repair or rehab for senior or disabled households. Three projects were completed in FY 2015, one emergency repair and two acquisition, rehab, resales.

HOME funds are focused on renter households at 50% of area median income and below; in fact 84% of the HOME assisted households were at 50% AMI or below. The moderate income households were homebuyers who received downpayment and closing costs assistance and homeowner rehab.

## Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Southern Nevada recognizes that an effective response to homelessness requires the coordinated effort of partners across healthcare, behavioral health, criminal justice and other fields. By improving data sharing and coordinating interventions, mainstream systems are able to reduce costs and improve client outcomes.

CCSS has two community outreach teams that provide coordinated entry and outreach to homeless clients, including those with limited English proficiency, who are living on the streets, in outlying uninhabited areas, and in tunnels. The Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (MCIT) and Caridad prioritize those unsheltered persons who will be most at risk if they continue to be unsheltered, with focus on veterans and adults with no children. This team, that includes Spanish speakers, mental health and substance abuse practitioners and social workers, actively engage homeless individuals and families and assess them for agency referrals. They utilize the common housing assessment tool to prioritize and identify referrals to supportive housing (SH) opportunities as they become available. This includes transitional housing, rapid re-housing and permanent housing. Additionally, the teams focus on outreach efforts to ensure that those who are unsheltered are aware of available services and have information on how to access services.

During this reporting period, MCIT had contact with 1,986 individuals with the majority of these categorized as homeless or at imminent risk of losing housing. These interactions lead to 2,333 community queue referrals that resulted in 481 program enrollments.

Coordinated intake for Veterans is provided through the Veterans Administration Community Resource and Referral Center (VACRRC) which has an outreach team that determines eligibility for homeless veterans who are seeking VA housing assistance. If it is determined that the veteran does not qualify for housing assistance, they are referred to the community queue and are awarded two preference points in the system.

Coordinated outreach has been conducted by the nine agencies included in the Southern Nevada Homeless Continuum of Care. These agencies including, HELP of Southern Nevada, Caridad, Veterans Affairs (VA), HELP USA, Salvations Army, US Vets, Straight from the Streets, WestCare, and Metropolitan Las Vegas Police Department, provide a full range of services for the homeless including, but not limited to, outreach, emergency shelter, transitional housing, prevention/diversion, and rapid rehousing services.

### Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

CCSS supports year round emergency shelter housing needs of homeless persons. According to the Housing Inventory Count (HIC), within Clark County (CC), there are 1,634 beds available through collaboration with Catholic Charities, HELP of Southern Nevada, Las Vegas Rescue Mission, Living Grace Homes, Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth, Safe House, Safe Nest, The Salvation Army, The Shade Tree, and WestCare. CC and North Las Vegas are Emergency Solutions Grantees (ESG) and utilize 60% of funds to support emergency shelter programs.

CCSS and all local jurisdictions support a regional budget for all of southern Nevada to provide inclement weather beds during the hottest and coldest days of the year. During the period November 15, 2015 – March 27, 2016, 344 inclement weather beds were supported in Clark County through collaboration between the following agencies: Catholic Charities (180 beds), HopeLink (34 beds), The Salvation Army (105 beds), and The Shade Tree (25 beds).

CCSS is the recipient of the Family Youth Services Bureau under the Administration for Children Youth and Families funding the Transitional Living Program which has been used to support a transitional living program through a partnership with Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth and a maternity group home through Southern Nevada Children First. CC has made it a priority to support transitional housing needs of homeless persons, especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth, by providing 824 beds through collaboration with Catholic Charities, Family Promise, Freedom House Sober Living, HELP of Southern Nevada, HELP USA, Nevada Partnership for Homeless Youth, New Genesis, Southern Nevada Children First, St. Jude's Ranch for Children, The Key Foundation, The Shade Tree, United States Veterans Initiative, and Women's Development Center.

In October 2015, Southern Nevada, was declared by our Federal partners, as having met Functional Zero for our Veteran population. The CoC will use lessons learned from reaching Functional Zero for our Veterans population to sustain this status and to attain goals of Functional Zero for the chronically homeless.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

CC has several programs that assist low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless especially during high-risk life events such as exiting health-care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth programs, and correctional programs and institutions. ClarkCountyFUSE, Homeless Prevention for Transition Age Youth (HPFTAY), and Housing and Healthcare (H2) are examples of these types of programs used throughout Clark County.

ClarkCountyFUSE (CCF) is a collaborative permanent supportive housing project between Clark County Social Service (CCSS), Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's (LVMPD) Clark County Detention Center (CCDC), and other community service organizations that addresses the housing needs of chronically homeless frequent individuals who cycle in and out of jails, emergency rooms, psychiatric facilities, and other high cost systems. The intent of the project is to provide frequent users with the permanent supportive housing and wrap around supportive services necessary to become stable and address the underlying causes of homelessness. Goals of this program include the de-population of detention centers, reduction in recidivism, and reduced exits to homelessness.

CCF operates as a housing first / harm reduction program which places individuals in PSH without preconditions or service participation requirements. This program adds 93 units to the community's housing inventory with prioritization given to individuals in jails, managed care organizations and social service systems. CCF is staffed with clinicians and licensed social workers who are SOAR trained and the program partners with organizations to address employment barriers, offer vocational rehab services, training opportunities, substance abuse and mental health assistance.

NV legislation allows young adults aging out of foster care options when they are turning 18 years old regarding services and financial support. Funds to Assist Former Foster Youth (FAFFY) assist foster youth transitioning to self-sufficiency. These youth have the option to remain under court jurisdiction and receive financial support along with move-in expenses and a stipend upon graduation from high school. Programs in Clark County to work with this population include WestCare Voyage, HELP of Southern Nevada Shannon West Homeless Youth Center, NV Partnership for Homeless Youth, and St. Jude's Ranch for Children's New Crossings.

The H2 initiative ensures a strong relationship between housing service providers and health care providers for homeless persons. An MOU exists between WestCare Nevada, local hospitals, and jurisdictions to provide funds for a community triage center. This supports emergency room diversion for those with substance abuse or mental health needs along with referrals for housing and ongoing treatments. An oversight committee ensures discharge from local programs is to a viable address.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals

## and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Seven local agencies distributed across Clark County (Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada, Clark County Social Service, Emergency Aid of Boulder City, Henderson Allied Community Advocates, HELP of Southern Nevada, Lutheran Social services and the Salvation Army located in Mesquite) offer rental and utility assistance to prevent the unnecessary homelessness of households experiencing a temporary crisis. Many local churches and synagogues assist their congregants and members with rental assistance to prevent homelessness.

CC utilizes coordinated outreach efforts to ensure that homeless individuals and families are assessed and offered services. The MCIT conducts housing assessments in the field and places clients in the community queue. By using diverse funding opportunities and collaborative efforts with local agencies, the SNH CoC is able to prioritize housing options for those families experiencing homelessness based on the severity of vulnerability and increase services and assistance available to this population. The CoC is developing a landlord collaboration to improve access to housing and affordable housing units.

The Vivo Housing Project (TVHP) is working to fill identified gaps, such as availability of affordable housing to reduce barriers to access of community amenities. Specialized positions (real estate acquisition specialist and housing navigator) are being filled to identify housing inventory options and to facilitate successful housing transitions for clients. TVHP also helps to fill the availability gap associated with service, specifically in the realm of increasing access to services designed to obtain identification documents.

HMIS monitors the returns to homelessness and provides reports to providers who are encouraged to monitor their performance in reducing recidivism rates of clients who have exited their programs. The CoC Coordinator provides TA for projects that have high recidivism rates to problem solve and create solutions for clients exiting the program. The CoC intends to provide standardized case management trainings that will assist providers with improving outcomes and reducing recidivism through case management, life skill development training, income and benefit acquisition assistance, employment assistance, access to mental health and medical care, legal assistance, sobriety support and job training.

### CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

### Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority (SNRHA) continues to utilize its Capital Fund Program (CFP) for the required capital improvements. During the last and current fiscal year the SNRHA upgraded waterlines laterals at Marble Manor and replace a backup generator at James Down Towers. The SNRHA CFP Funds will be used as one of the financing tools to fund comprehensive modernization and new construction under the Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) Program and Mixed Finance Program.

Under RAD the SNRHA converted in 2014 Landsman Gardens, a 100-unit family public housing development in the Valley View neighborhood of Henderson, Nevada to Project Based Section 8. Landsman Gardens is the first FHA-financed project in the nation to close under the Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) program. Construction was completed December 2014 with 100% lease-up March 2015.

The SNRHA submitted December 2013 a RAD application for Vera Johnson Manor B (AMP 314) anticipating a Conditional Housing Assistance Payment (CHAP) agreement issuance by January 2014. However; the CHAP was received April 2015. In an effort to preserve the HOME Funds and Tax Credit Allocations, the SNRHA proceeded with a Mixed Finance Proposal as an Interim Plan for closing mid-April, 2015. Construction was completed May 2016 with a RAD conversion anticipated October 2016. The SNRHA is partnering with Nevada HAND for this project

The SNRHA in March 2015 submitted a RAD application for Biegger Estates (AMP 406) and received a CHAP agreement in July 2015. The SNRHA submitted in May 2015 a 9% Tax Credit Application for the Rehabilitation of all 119 units at this site and received an allocation in July 2015. The project closed in May 2016. Construction is scheduled in phases with an estimated completion within 13 months from the notice to proceed date or June 2017. The SNRHA will self-develop this project

Additionally, in March 2015 the SNRHA submitted a RAD application for Rose Gardens and received a CHAP agreement in July 2015. The SNRHA is also planning to submit in FY 2016 a Bond/4% Tax Credit Application for the Re-development of all 120 units (on-site or off-site). The project has received HOME Funds allocation in the amount of \$1MIL from Clark County and \$500K from City of North Las Vegas. Financing closing is anticipated for December 2016 with a construction completion of February 2018. The SNRHA may self-develop or partner with a developer for this project.

### **SNRHA Housing Continued**

In 2015 the SNRHA also submitted a RAD portfolio application for several of their public housing inventory. First Group includes: 1)Otto Merida (AMP405), 2)Lubertha Johnson (AMP401), 3)Bennett Plaza (AMP401), 4)Espinoza Terrace (404), 5)Hullum Homes (AMP407), 6)Jones Gardens (AMP407),

7)Sartini Plaza (AMP402) & 8)Sartini Annex (AMP402), 9)Archie Grant (South Parcel) (AMP401) and 10)Ernie Cragin Terrace (AMP406) totaling 844 public housing units. Second Group includes: 1) Schaffer Heights (AMP404), 2) Aida Brents (AMP403), 3) Levy Gardens (403), 4) James Down Towers (AMP402), 5) Hampton Court (Amp404), 6) Simmons (AMP406) and 7) Sherman Gardens Annex (AMP408) totaling 564 public housing units. The RAD portfolio is pending HUD review and issuance of Commitment to enter into a Housing Assistance Payment contract (CHAP) for the First Group. In 2014 the City of North Las Vegas as the Lead applicant and the SNRHA as the co-lead applicant submitted a Choice Neighborhood Initiative (CNI) Panning Grant. The CNI award letter was received January 2015 through the Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$485,000. The money will be used to prepare a Transformation Plan to revitalize North Las Vegas Urban Core Neighborhood, which includes the Rose Gardens Senior Public Housing and Buena Vista Springs communities. The Transformation Plan is due early 2017.

The SNRHA jointly with the City of Las Vegas are evaluating the future of the three vacant lots located in the general area of Bonanza and 28th Street [former public housing Ernie Cragin Terrace (ECT) Sites NV209, NV210 & NV213] and the proposed use to improve marketability of future housing in this area of the City. In 2016 the Library District in partnership with the City and the SNRHA completed a land swap with the SNRHA one of the three ECT vacant parcels located at 28th Street & Bonanza and Library District vacant parcel located at 28th and Sunrise.

The Authority's other modernization activities are addressing necessary work items in order of priority as established in the Capital Plan.SNRHA has introduced a training model to all agency staff designed to improve customer satisfaction.The Authority sold Fifty seven (57) public housing scattered site units under its Public Housing Homeownership Program in FY03, FY04, FY05, FY06, FY07, FY08, and FY2012. Additionally, forty-six (46) Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Homeowners are under contract.The Capital Fund Program continues to include other provisions that are aimed to increase the marketability of Authority-owned units. Non-viable units and developments are identified and continue to be revitalized through various approaches.Where marketability cannot be achieved; the Authority is requesting approval for the demolition of units and/or identifying other sources of funding to accommodate the capital needs.

Updated Physical Needs and Portfolio Assessment to identify current capital improvement needs.SNRHA will seek HUD approval to implement a Force Account to perform vacancy reduction duties as well as select other capital improvement duties. The initiative will reduce the need for contractors; create new jobs of which one or more qualified residents may be hired to promote economic self-sufficiency.The SNRHA may outsource certain programs elements for agency sustainability including but not limited to:HQS InspectionsSelected Public Housing Property Management.The SNRHA will ensure that Executive Order 13495, No displacement of Qualified Workers Under Service Contracts signed by President Obama on January 2009, will be followed.SNRHA conducted a PNA and will develop a consolidated plan to identify sites for modernization, upgrades, and improvements. SNRHA continues implementing the

approved 5-Year Strategic Plan.

## Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) and Public Housing Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) programs have merged. As of April 1, 2016, the FSS program has 236 voluntary slots and 127 mandatory slots.

The Authority continues to develop partnerships with local service providers, training resources and educational institutions with the goal of making self-sufficiency available to all residents and participants. Year to date, we have established partnerships with a total of 89 community service providers. Commitments with these organizations are established either verbally or through MOU's.

The Authority has two homeownership programs under the Housing Choice Voucher and Public Housing Programs; each program continues to assist low-income families reach the dream of owning a home of their own.

SNRHA expects to expand its Community Partners program with public, private, and faith-based agencies.

SNRHA will enter into Memorandum of Understanding offering public housing units and/or turnover vouchers with recognized homeless shelter providers who provide supportive services for the homeless in efforts to eliminate homelessness in the Southern Nevada Region.

SNRHA also seeks other grants that may promote self-sufficiency or assist seniors to age in place.

### Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority is not designated as troubled by HUD.

### CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

In 2015, Clark County subsidized the building permit fees and impact fees for ASI's Veteran's Supportive Housing, Agate II Senor Apartments and Russell II Senior Apartments using \$1.8 million in HOME/LIHTF funds. Clark County also waives the fees for the rezoning of parcels that will be affordable housing upon completion.

In 2015, Clark County awarded \$20 million in Private Activity Bonds to the State of Nevada Housing Division for future affordable housing development. A project was submitted to the State and is moving forward into the financing phase. It is an acquisition and rehabilitation of an existing affordable housing development called Summerhill Apartments. Another \$27,667,537 in bonds was awarded to the State of Nevada Housing Division for their Single Family Mortgage Program. These funds will assist hundreds of families to obtain affordable mortgages to purchase homes in Southern Nevada. In FY 2015, Clark County expended \$6.6 million on affordable housing projects using HOME/LIHTF and committed another \$3.4 million for future affordable housing development.

Density bonuses are available for senior and supportive housing through a special use permitting process. The maximum density allowed in an R-3 zone is 18 dwelling units per gross acre and in an R-4 zone is 25 dwelling units per gross acre. This increases to 22 dwelling units per gross acre and 32 dwelling units per gross acre respectively for senior and supportive housing developments. Thus, ASI's Veteran's Supportive Housing development of 50 units on a 1.74 acre site would have only allowed 43 units without the density bonus demonstrating the value of this extremely important zoning alternative.

Clark County participated in the drafting of the RTC Coordinated Transportation Plan 2015 addressing in part the transportation needs of seniors. The Clark County Consolidated Land Use Goals (July 2015) support Transit Oriented Development and pedestrian and vehicular connections between developments.

Clark County has utilized the SNPLMA Section 7(b) provision for affordable housing developments since its inception. The State of Nevada is developing the Agate I Senior Apartments and Agate II Senior Apartments on land obtained through SNPLMA section 7 (b). CRMU provided technical support and HOME funding for both affordable rental apartment projects. Agate I Senior Apartments is complete and leased up while Agate II Senior Apartments are nearing the end of construction.

### Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Affordable housing, particularly for renters at 50% of area median income and below, continues to be an issue of concern in Clark County. In an effort to address this issue, particularly for people at extremely low-income and homeless, Clark County is working to funds projects that meet those income levels. Clark County funded the ASI Veteran's Supportive Housing project which is currently under construction and includes housing vouchers for the majority of residents. Of the 32 HOME assisted households in FY 2015, 84% were households at 50% AMI or below. Fifty-seven percent of the CDBG funded public service people assisted were low and extremely low income.

The 2015–2019 CDBG Five Year Capital Improvement Plan was authorized and projects are underway that will provide an investment of \$26 million in improvements within low and moderate income neighborhoods and for low/moderate income residents.

### Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Factors that may increase lead exposure among children elsewhere in the United States do not exist with high frequency in Nevada. The U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC) asserts that children living in houses built before 1978 have a greater risk of exposure to lead-based paint; however, most buildings in Nevada were built after 1978. Approximately 65% of the housing built in Las Vegas has occurred from 1980 to the present. However, in an effort to implement the Lead Based Paint Regulations, the County and its consortium partners have undertaken the activities described below.

All CDBG and HOME funded housing programs, including Homebuyer Assistance Programs and Tenant Based Rental ASsistance programs are required to provide Lead-Based Paint informational brochures to help educate families, particularly those with children.

SNHD screenings using the LeadCare II blood lead analyzer continued in FY 2015. In most cases housing components were not found to be the cause of the child's lead exposure. A common source of lead identified in the homes was ceramic dishes and pots that were used for cooking or serving food. These various pieces of ceramic ware may or may not be the main cause of the EBLLs for those cases. Additional leaded items found in these homes included plastic toys, keys, tile, necklace charms, backpacks, ceramic sink, leaded dust, suitcase, and jewelry, high risk hobbies of automotive repair and artistic paint and mixing.

When Clark County School District is required to abate or remediate actual lead hazards they are required to conduct and pass clearance tests before those areas of the school are put back into use. Interim controls are permitted as a solution to some of the hazards SNHD has discovered. However routine monitoring of those areas are a part of their compliance plan. All abatement or remediation work is to take place when children are not present, this may include but is not limited to school holidays, scheduled breaks, staff development days, weekends, and nights.

### Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

A significant number of projects and programs funded through both HOME and CDBG funds are designed to reduce the number of families in poverty, whether through educational opportunities or affordable housing development. In FY 2015, County general funds and North Las Vegas CDBG supported the provision of numerous senior and family assistance programs including teen medical and dental care through the Huntridge Teen Clinic and respite care for parents with disabled children through the Foundation for Positively Kids.

The Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) Program is designed to assist those families at the lowest end of the economic scale and was provided to 99 households. The Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority operated the TBRA program for North Las Vegas using LIHTF through referrals from HELP of Southern Nevada, Mojave Adult, Child and Family Services, Aid for AIDS of Nevada, VA, SNAMHS, Safe House and Lutheran Social Services. All of these households were homeless, many with a severely mentally ill member. All households were extremely low-income, with an area median income between 0 and 30%. Additionally, North Las Vegas funded TBRA assistance to HELP of Southern Nevada for their CABHI program which targets chronically homeless households.

### Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Southern Nevada Strong is a collaborative regional planning effort, funded by a \$3.5 million dollar grant from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). It provided the resources to conduct in-depth research and community engagement efforts to look at issues facing our community and propose collaborative solutions. All jurisdictions have several staff participating and helping to identify gaps in services with the ultimate goal to fill those gaps using federal, state and local funds. Clark County participated with several working groups from Southern Nevada Strong including the Housing Task Group and the Regional Analysis of Impediments Task Group. The project is now staffed by the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) and Clark County CRMU will continue to participate in implementation of recommendations to address gaps. RTC recently hired new staff for Southern Nevada Strong and the kickoff begins in September 2016 with a half-day summit to identify priorities for moving forward.

The Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition (SNRPC) is charged with planning for the future needs of the region, including housing. Each jurisdiction within Clark County is taking part in this effort, as are the staffs of most of the departments and divisions administering federal funding.

## Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

As the major recipients of federal resources in the Clark County HCP Consortium, it is important for Clark

County, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Boulder City and Mesquite to share information on programming issues and joint projects frequently. Staff members in Clark County, Las Vegas and North Las Vegas regularly coordinate the timetables for the issuance of program applications. The CDBG Consortium members also meet on a regular basis to discuss policy and implementation issues. Clark County, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Henderson, Clark County Social Service, State of Nevada Housing Division and HUD Representatives continued to meet on a bi-monthly basis to discuss issues related to various joint funded projects and HUD programs. The County HOME Consortium was renewed in 2015 for the years 2016-2018 and includes Clark County and North Las Vegas.

Southern Nevada jurisdictions continued to address gaps in institutional structure in serving the homeless. Continuing with the regional approach to end homelessness "Help Hope Home," the SNH CoC Board is experiencing active participation by local jurisdictions, government agencies, non-profits and business partners. Five (5) of the jurisdictions in Southern Nevada (Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas and Clark County) continue to jointly fund regional efforts and programs continues through contributions to the regional budget for HMIS, inclement weather shelter, and the homeless census.

## Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

This CAPER documents the actions taken in 2015-2016 under the 2015 Regional Analysis of Impediments (RAI) list of impediments.

In 2015, Clark County entered into a three (3) year contract with Silver State Fair Housing (SSFH), which includes provision of Fair Housing Discrimination Testing, trainings and presentations, and claim assistance. The County allocated \$125,000 of its Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Administrative funds to pay for the contracted services. SFFH assisted 1,124 people with general housing inquiries and fair housing complaints. Two claims were forwarded to the Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity in San Francisco. In all, 19 claims were forwarded to HUD in FY 2015. SSFH conducted 19 paired phone tests and 11 paired site tests during the fourth quarter (April – June).

A portion of the CRMU contract with Silver State Fair Housing Council (SSFHC) the provision of Trainings and Presentations to local governments, landlords, Real Estate associations and the public as well as publish advertisements addressing fair housing issues. The latest training was the "ABC's of Fair Housing" class held on May 12, 2016, which was attended by 32 people whose exit surveys indicated the information was useful.

Community Resources Management unit of Social Service participated in the development of and supports maintaining the NVHousingSearch.org housing locator database system. This system allows families to conduct customized searches for rental property that meets their specific needs. Social

Service is working with NVHousingSearch to develop a list of housing specifically for people on the Coordinated Intake list are chronically homeless and who need permanent supportive housing.

Community Resources Management unit also funded development of the Boulder Highway Collaborative Campus which will consist of 300 units of affordable family rental apartment housing, social services facility, Boys & Girls Club facility and future health clinic adjacent to a newly constructed charter school at Boulder Highway and Desert Inn Road. The charter school functions as a magnet school accepting enrollment based upon student performance, which creates a positive synergy between the family housing, social services and after-school educational enhancement programs and the school. Construction is underway on the first multifamily housing on the property – Boulder Pines I.

Clark County has also assigned a CRM Team Member to serve as the Fair Housing Officer to whom the public is referred when they call the county with Fair Housing concerns. Clark County trained its phone operators to refer all calls about housing discrimination to the jurisdiction's Fair Housing Officer or to Silver State Fair Housing Council. The Clark County Community Resources Management Webpage contains information informing people of the resources available if they have fair housing concerns.

### CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

The standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan to end homelessness include monitoring utilization rates of shelter, drawdown rates for non-profit proviers and whether funds have been recaptured by HUD. Specific performance outcomes are monitored including the percent of people exiting to permanent housing and leaving programs with an increase in income. ESG Staff also works with the CoC Monitoring Working Group to monitor both CoC and ESG subrecipients for performance outcomes and to ensure long-term compliance.

Clark County and North Las Vegas hold technical assistance workshops for the CDBG, ESG and HOME programs during the grant application process. CDBG, ESG and HOME program manuals are updated with the latest guidelines and regulations. Off-site and/or on-site monitoring was completed at least once in the last program year for each non-profit organization. Subrecipients and project sponsors that did not spend their grant funds in a timely manner had their grant funding reprogrammed for eligible activities. Many subrecipients and project sponsors received technical assistance on an individual basis from County and City staff.

Performance measures and outcomes were included in the Commission and Council approved agreements for each project or program listed in the 2015 Action Plan.

Further, the County Purchasing Department staffs the Business Development Advisory Council (BDAC) was created by ordinance in 1987 and its mission is to assist the County to increase the number of minority, women, and small businesses doing business with the County. BDAC is comprised of members of organizations representing small and minority and women owned businesses to help promote their participation in the county purchasing process. Clark County has also created the Business Opportunity & Workforce Development (BOWD) program. Small business owners who sign up for the BOWD program receive professional guidance and support as they build capacity to compete for government contracts through a combination of classroom sessions, mentoring, coaching and County relationshipbuilding activities. Participating companies also gain access to skilled and unskilled labor required to help them complete new work.

### Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.

Per CAPER regulations, the draft of the end of year report on ESG, CDBG and HOME is made available for 15 days as advertised in the Review-Journal and El Tiempo newspapers. Further, the draft is posted on the Clark County website.

### CR-45 - CDBG 91.520(c)

North Las Vegas will be moving over \$300,000 in old CDBG funds out of programs that are no longer viable and into three new parks projects. A Substantial Amendment will specify the funds being moved and the locations of the parks that will be improved. Clark County has not changed its CDBG program objectives and is working diligently on implementing its 4th Five-Year CDBG Capital Improvement Plan.

The following properties were inspected for housing codes and other applicable regulations - Nevada HAND's Harrison Pines, Apache Pines, Sierra Pines, Tropical Pines, Rochelle Pines. Also inspected was Silver State Housing's Sonoma Palms and Fore Property Company's Arbor Pointe. A table is attached outlining all of the HOME units that should have been inspected on-site this program year based upon the schedule in 92.504(d). For Clark County, of the 34 properties that required inspection in FY 2015, 20 were inspected and 14 were not inspected. CRMU is hiring a HUD Programs Compliance Grants Coordinator to remedy this situation. This person will work with our construction specialist to ensure that all on-site monitoring and inspections are completed on time. See the attached list outlining the properties. North Las Vegas completed all of their annual inspections and there were no findings. Again, please see the attached list.

## Provide an assessment of the jurisdiction's affirmative marketing actions for HOME units. 92.351(b)

HOME subrecipients are required to outline an affirmative marketing plan in their application for funding. Currently, tenant rolls and client lists are scrutinized during desk audits and monitoring visits to ensure that the subrecipients are, in fact, successful in serving typically underserved populations. The Consortium has a comprehensive Affirmative Marketing Plan. The plan includes incorporating the Equal Housing Opportunity logo and slogan into program materials; requiring subrecipients to use affirmative fair housing marketing practices when soliciting renters or buyers; and requiring subrecipients to make a good faith effort to solicit eligible persons who are unlikely to apply for housing assistance. Desk audits continue to document that HOME projects are serving underserved populations.

In FY 2015, of the 25 HOME renters, 46% were White, 38% were Black, 8% were Asian, 8% were Pacific Islander and 8% were Hispanic. Of the 7 homeowners assisted, 14% were white, 43% were Black, 14% were Asian and 28% were Hispanic.

The Clark County HOME Consortium receipted \$561,316.13 in program income in FY 2015.

The majority of funds have not yet been expended. \$7,816.01 was expended on 2 projects undertaken by North Las Vegas through Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority consisting of the acquisition, rehabilitation and rental of the two properties. No tenant characteristics are yet available as the projects are still under construction.

# Describe other actions taken to foster and maintain affordable housing. 91.220(k) (STATES ONLY: Including the coordination of LIHTC with the development of affordable housing). 91.320(j)

Within the Clark County HOME Consortium, public sector and non-profit groups have worked to increase the supply of affordable rental and owner occupied housing in Clark County. The Consortium assisted 99 low-income renter households with incomes at 30% or below of median income through Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) programs.

In FY 2015, Clark County CRM completed three new construction developments serving low-income seniors. Accessible Space Inc. completed the Bonnie Lane Senior Apartments, a 66-unit development that received Low-Income Housing Tax Credits for construction. Community Development Programs Center of Nevada completed the 57-unit Mixed Income II (Dr. Paul Meacham) Senior Apartments and CLSN completed the 80-unit Winterwood II (Acapella Duet) Senior Apartments. In addition to these three developments, North Las Vegas assisted in the acquisition and rehabilitation of the 115-unit Rose Garden Townhomes using State LIHTF funds. Clark County has provided off-cycle Private Activity Bond Cap for the rehabilitation of the Sierra Pointe Apartments, a 159-unit expiring Project Based Section 8 property, thereby keeping it affordable for the long-term.

Low-income homeowners were provided assistance through Rebuilding Together of Southern Nevada. RTCIA assisted 2 households in FY 2015.

Clark County provided \$25 illion in 2015 Private Activity Bond Cap for the State of Nevada Housing Division (NHD) to provide low-interest mortgages. From January 2015 through July 2015, the Single Family Mortgage Program provided 702 loans in Clark County alone. An additional \$23 million in Bond Cap was awarded to the State of Nevada Housing Division for future affordable rental housing projects in unincorporated Clark County. North Las Vegas works with Neighborhood Housing Services of Southern Nevada to provide downpayment assistance to qualifying low- and moderate-income households. In FY 2015, 9 households received downpayment assistance to become homeowners.

Clark County expended HOME/LIHTF funds on many new construction rental developments in FY 2015. Clark County assisted several LIHTC developments including Community Development Programs Center of Nevada's Mixed Income II Senior Apartments, ASI's Bonnie Lane Senior Apartments and Russell II Senior Apartments, all of which are fully leased. Several other projects are currently under construction including ASI's Casa Oliva, Veteran's Supportive Housing and Agate II Senior Apartments. Clark Couty funded Allied Argenta for the rehabilitation of the Summerhill Family Apartments using State HOME funds.

# **11.** Project Outcomes Data measured under the performance standards developed in consultation with the CoC(s)

Of the beneficiaries assisted with shelter and rapid re-housing, 37.6% went on to permanent housing, 43.9% to temporary or transitional housing, 3% to an institution, 2% to other and 13% to unknown. These outcomes are an improvement over prior years but more work is needed to increase the number of people moving onto permanent housing. The high numbers of people ending up in temporary or transitional housing is due to a lack of permanent supportive housing in the community.



Variety Early Learning Center will use these funds to provide Child Care Tuition Assistance to 5 children of low-income families. This essential program subsidizes the cost for these families giving them the freedom to seek employment, participate in job training, recover from a crisis, or remain gainfully employed, all while knowing their child is receiving a quality education.
