SUMMARY - An ordinance to amend Title 22, Chapter 22.04 of the Clark County Code to add a new definition to 22.04.045, and add a New Subsection 22.04.053 entitled Single-Use Restroom related to single-user restrooms pursuant to NRS 651, effective October 1, 2021; and providing for other matters properly relating thereto.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 22, CHAPTER 22.04 OF THE CLARK COUNTY CODE TO ADD A NEW DEFINITION TO 22.04.045, AND ADD A NEW SUBSECTION 22.04.053 ENTITLED SINGLE-USE RESTROOM RELATED TO SINGLE-USER RESTROOMS PURSUANT TO NRS 651, EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2021; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF CLARK, STATE OF NEVADA, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title 22, Chapter 22.04 is amended to read as follows:

22.04.045 - Definitions.

Add a definition of "Single-stall Restroom" to read as follows:

Single-Stall Restroom. A single-user toilet facility that is intended for individual use that contains a single toilet or a single urinal; or a toilet facility that contains a toilet and a urinal which is not separated from each other by enclosure within a stall, in accordance with NRS 651.

22.04.053– Single-Use Restroom

A subsection, designated "2902.1.2 Single-User toilet facility and bathing fixtures.", is hereby amended by adding to read as follows:

2902.1.2 Single-user Toilet Facility and Bathing Room Fixtures. The plumbing fixtures located in *single-stall restroom*, single-user toilet facilities and bathing rooms, including family or assisted-use toilet and bathing rooms that are required by Section 1109.2, shall contribute toward the total number of required plumbing fixtures for a building or tenant space. *Single-stall restrooms, single [Single]-user toilet facilities and bathing rooms, and family or assisted-use toilet rooms and bathing rooms shall not be identified for use by either sex, but may be labeled for use by any persons including without limitations “All-Gender Bathroom” or “All-Accessible Bathroom”.*

2902.1.2.1 Single-user Facility Use. A *single-stall restroom*, single-user toilet facilities and bathing rooms, including family or assisted-use toilet and bathing rooms shall be inclusive and accessible as possible to a person of any gender identity or expression, in accordance with NRS 651, including without limitation by allowing:

1. A parent or guardian of a child to enter the facility with the child;
2. A person with a disability to enter the facility with his or her caregiver; and
3. A person of any gender identity or expression to use the facility as needed

A subsection, designated "2902.4 Signage", is amended to read as follows:

2902.4 Signage.

2902.4 Signage. Required public facilities shall be provided with signs that designate the sex as required by Section 2902.2. Single-stall restrooms, single-user toilet facilities and bathing rooms, including family or assisted-use toilet and bathing rooms shall be provided with signage as required by 2902.1.2. Signs shall be readily visible and located near the entrance to each toilet facility. Signs for accessible toilet facilities shall comply with Section 1111.

SECTION 2. If any section of this ordinance or portion thereof is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate the remaining parts of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. All ordinances, parts of ordinances, chapters, sections, subsections, clauses, phrases, or sentences contained in the Code of Clark County in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect October 1, 2021, and be in force from and after the date set forth below, after its passage and the publication thereof by title only, together with the names of the County Commissioners voting for or against its passage, in a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in Clark County, Nevada, at least once a week for a period of two (2) weeks.
