

## **Public Notice**

The Clark County Desert Conservation Program (hereinafter Clark County), hereby gives notice of the County's intent to revise the flood hazard information, generally located between the Warm Springs Road river crossing and extending approximately 2,000 feet downstream. The flood hazard revisions are being proposed as part of Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) Case No. 22-09-1567R for a project along the Muddy River. Clark County is proposing to conduct restoration adjacent to the Muddy River to reconnect the river's floodplain to the existing river channel in order to enhance inundation and wetting created by natural flood regimes and create habitat for native vegetation and bird species covered by the Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP) for Clark County, Nevada.

Once the project has been completed, Clark County will submit a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) request to FEMA that will, in part, revise the following flood hazards along the Muddy River.

The Special Flood Hazard Area (Zone A) extent will increase on Clark County owned parcels and decrease on select parcels that are adjacent to the project along the west side of the Muddy River.
