

## Homemaker Home Health Aide

The Homemaker Home Health Aide Program provides short and long term homemaking and personal care services to individuals, with special attention given to the needs of low-income, elderly/disabled individuals.

### *Target Population / Area*

Residents of Clark County, who demonstrate a need for service, and are not eligible for other programs.

### *Eligibility Requirements*

- Resident of Clark County
- Not eligible for similar services through insurance or another program
- 18 years of age or older
- Disabled and/or have a medical need for services
- Provide income and asset information to Clark County Social Service needed to determine eligibility.

### *Services include:*

- Grocery shopping
- Laundry
- Light housekeeping
- Food preparation
- Personal care (baths and grooming)
- RX pick-up



## Long Term Care (LTC)

Clark County Social Service can assist in securing appropriate long term care for any Clark County resident who is unable to function in independent living because of medical problems.

Eligibility for long term care is determined by an assessment of need and pre-established eligibility criteria. All prior resource programs to assist with payment of long term care are pursued prior to Clark County Social Service providing payment.

Request for LTC services are received from the community, family members, long term care facilities, hospitals and other agencies that have knowledge of potential long term care cases, or clients applying on their own behalf.

LTC services are provided through the following contracted licensed facilities:

### *Adult Day Health Care*

These facilities provide organized day programs of therapeutic, health, and social activities and services for chronically ill, elderly or disabled adults for restoring individuals to his or her best possible functional level.

### *Adult Group Care and Assisted Living*

These are residential care facilities. They are ideal for persons who, because of age or disability, would not be able to provide for their own household needs and need someone in attendance in case of emergencies.

## *Nursing Home - Free Standing Intermediate Care*

These facilities provide custodial care and supervision under the direction of a professional registered nurse.

There is a strong emphasis on social and rehabilitative services, given in a living situation as normal as possible. The basic goal is assisting the individual to become involved in learning to accept responsibility for his or her own health needs as much as possible.

### *Skilled Nursing*

These facilities provide 24-hour nursing care under the supervision of a professional registered nurse. In skilled nursing facilities, patients may receive either skilled nursing care services which meet the Medicare criteria or full custodial care services for patients whose care needs do not fall within those guidelines.

To request long term care assistance from Clark County Social Service, the following is generally required:

- A completed long term care application, or an existing open case with CCSS
- Have a medical need for long term care
- Meet the level of care criteria appropriate for the type of care requested
- Meet income and resource eligibility criteria as determined by type of care requested



## Additional Services

- Publish and distribute the “Royal Pages”, a senior resource directory.
- Provide utility assistance through Project Reach to seniors age 62 or over and disabled individuals who are medically fragile.
